CAVEAT'S LITTLE CHURCH of MANY NAMES

This little church was built by a small Catholic community.
32 souls altogether, mostly Slovak & Polish and a few Australians.
It was built in 1955 and is in the parish of Yea, on land donated by Mr
Doug McAlpin of Fort William. Prior to the little church being built,
Mass was celebrated at Mr George Zach's place that became Betty &
David Ladbury's place. Money was raised by raffles and donations that
came from all over Australia, from Catholics and non-Catholics in the
surrounding districts and even the USA & Canada.
Many new Australians of Slovak origins from Melbourne & Sydney

collected 200 pounds toward the new church.

It was officially opened and blessed in 1956 by Bishop Fox as St. Mary's Church, and Father Sencik said the first Mass.

Mr Peter Yurrita designed it, and helped the other parishioners with the building of the church.

A Slovak artist, Mr Oskar Fikar painted a picture of Our Lady of Dolours & donated it to the church.

This is how our church later became known as Our Lady of Dolours.

It wasn't long before the Catholic community felt the need for a bell and so they began building a bell tower, again with local labour with the bricklayer Mr Joe Kozak himself a new arrival in Australia. The bell was especially cast in Germany.

Monsignor Hannan performed a blessing of the bell.

It was then decided to build a Grotto, using many tons of local granite gathered from near & far. The same bricklayer, with Father Tibor & many parishioners built the Grotto which was blessed by Monsignor Hannan.

The tree from which the Cross was sawn, was locally grown and taken in one piece to the sawmill in Alexandra, then being Ruoak Timbers.

The painting on the bell tower represents Saint Isadore — the Good Farmer.

Over the years there have been four weddings and a funeral (Peter Lebidka) plus several christenings. In 1973 a Eucharistic Congress Mass was celebrated here. In 1981 celebrations were held for the silver jubilee of the church, and the silver wedding anniversary of the first couple that were married in the new church.




The colourful embroidered altar-cloth has a picture of Mary of Seven Sorrows.

The writing on the cloth reads "Mother who cares for us always, pray for us sinners".

That's how the church came to be known as Our Lady of Seven Sorrows, but was blessed as St. Mary's Church.

Anne Margaret Hlinka and Emil Kopanica were the first couple to be married in the new church by Father Sowersby. Irene Bennett played the organ and a lady sang at Anne and Emil's wedding to the strains of the

Presbyterian organ. A movie film of their wedding was taken by Mr Kemp from Yea.

Terri Williams & Duncan Taylor were the second couple.

Terri Williams taught at Highlands School. Sue Conos and Sean Donnelly were the 3rd couple and then later Jacinta McLennan and Andrew Broland.
