

'Attaining a Balance'

Landcare Strategy for the Hughes Creek Catchment

Sarah Nicholas – 1995

In 1994 the National Landcare Program and BP supported the Hughes Creek Catchment Collaborative to hire a consultant and develop a strategy document for the area with as much community input as possible.

The document was split in to two parts, one as a resource document complete

with recommendations and references and the second part promoting the projects and practical applications of the recommendations in the reference document.

Our aim was 'to achieve sustainable and viable agriculture and other land uses within an ecologically balanced catchment'.

The outcomes we expected were:

- * Increase profitability
- * Weeds and pests controlled or eliminated
- * Wide adoption of new management systems to improve productivity
- * Increased amounts of on ground works
- * Increased participation and knowledge in the community
- * Improved quality of water leaving the catchment
- * Increased number of strategically place trees and shrubs
- * Improved wildlife habitat

There was no time frame for these tasks as they were freely able to admit that setting a time frame to reverse over 100 years of unsuitable land management would be unrealistic.

The Hughes Creek Catchment likely had both the Molka and the Taungurung Aboriginal tribes in the area; however at the time of this document being produced in 1995 no survey for significant Aboriginal sites had been carried out. The Dropmore pastoral lease was one of the first in the area and comprised of almost 104 square kilometres mostly in the Hughes Creek Catchment and was taken up in 1838 just 4 years after permanent European Settlement began in Victoria.

Other large leases in the catchment included Tarcombe, Rocky Passes and Habbies Howe. Areas of forest were cleared by ringbarking, tracks formed and hard hoofed sheep introduced. The resource 'Landcare Strategy for the Hughes Creek Catchment' gathered their information from a comprehensive survey of the farmers in the area. With 32% of landholders covering over 50% of the productive land contributing.

Over the next few weeks I will outline some of the strategies included in this document and where we are sitting now, 22 years on.



Justice and Freedom

I am trying to discover the primary values that underscore current political activity.

The Prime Minister trying to bring together the Liberal Party factions, recently said, 'the Liberal Party stands for freedom or nothing'. He would probably explain this further in terms of free enterprise, free trade, free speech, freedom from regulations, freedom from government interference, freedom from high taxation and free competition.

There is however, a dark side to freedom. Some use freedom as an excuse to exploit people (Uber did it during train emergency) and abuse the environment (some cotton farmers steal water). Others avoid taxation (to rob you and me) and abuse those 'who look different'. Freedom does not produce equity and is not necessarily fair for everybody.

There is another possible value that is not often expressed, namely 'justice'. This includes social responsibility, equality, equity, fairness, respect for the environment, care for those most vulnerable, cooperation and sharing resources.

Though it is not always explicitly stated, there appears to be a struggle between freedom and justice, as the paramount value that determines policy and action. I confess to be rather sceptical when people go on and on about freedom. In many ways, it is a song sung mainly by the privileged.

You cannot have true freedom without real justice. Justice is essential to freedom. Freedom without justice is an illusion. I do not regard myself as free when there are people who are not free. How can we be free, when we neglect the most vulnerable in our society, neglect the stranger, reject the refugee, despise those who are different, abuse children and monopolise wealth?

Are we a free or a just country? Sadly, we are neither. What do you think?
