### LANDCARE LAYS GROUNDWORK FOR LAMBING GULLY'S LUSHNESS

I know I am not the only one enjoying the gorgeous displays of wattles around our district this year after the long cold winter. In 2010 Whitehead's Creek Landcare Group with the help of school children and community volunteers planted out a long section of Lambing Gully Road that was devoid of vegetation.



Nearby farmers assisted with the project, which was carried out in freezing cold and rainy weather. The kids must have been cold but I think they really enjoyed the day.

A trip up Lambing Gully Road now reveals the fruits of their labour, a truly beautiful corridor of habitat that is alive with small birds. This corridor is important because it provides North South movement for small species and is therefore valuable in times of a warming climate. As time goes on the vegetation will shade out

the grasses. But for now it is a beautiful addition to our local district. In the photo you can see a direct seeded line of plants, with scattered plantings in the distance.


