### Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

So...let's talk about **Climate Change**, not whether it exists or not but what it actually is. A couple of weeks ago I came across this very succinct summary in the latest Tahbilk newsletter. I found it to be very easy to understand and with the approval of its author, Hayley Purbrick, reprint it here. Many thanks Hayley.

N.B ppm = parts per million "Carbon is not well understood so we're going back to basics to explain the Green House effect...Let's start at the beginning, I think many of us have forgotten we live in the universe on a planet called Earth. The Earth is the only planet that can sustain life and support life in all its forms: from basic living micro-organisms to highly sophisticated and intelligent human beings. And without it we don't have anything. But what makes the Earth so special?

- \* A breathable atmosphere; oxygen is present in the atmosphere and water, released by plants.
- \* A suitable stable climate caused by the moderate amount of carbon in the atmosphere.
- \* Water in abundance in 3 forms frozen (ice), liquid (seas/lakes/rivers) and gas (clouds) which help regulate and store carbon dioxide.
- \* Regular sunlight (24 hours) that promotes plant growth and photosynthesis (the plants process of releasing oxygen).
- \* Perfect distance from the sun
- \* The ozone layer prevents harmful UV rays from the sun hitting the Earth's surface.
- \* The Earth's magnetic sphere protects the atmosphere from the sun's radiation.

You might also hear people say climate change, or the warming of the planet, is because of natural causes - erupting volcanoes and the like. But this is not true. The Earth has a pretty nifty self-regulation regime, a thermostatic cycle, which keeps it in check. This process is called the Greenhouse Effect and CO2 is the primary greenhouse gas which helps to regulate temperature.

The problem is once you add humans into the mix, particularly the burning of fossil fuels (coal, oil and natural gas) agriculture and land clearing you increase the amount of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere. This creates an enhanced greenhouse effect which is contributing to warming the Earth. Prior to the Industrial Revolution, carbon dioxide stood at roughly 280ppm. Since then human activities have committed a massive amount of carbon pollution to the atmosphere. It has driven carbon dioxide levels to record highs year after year currently sitting at 400ppm driving to dangerously high levels. So you can see we, people, businesses, are contributing to global warming and throwing the Earth's natural thermometer out of whack. This isn't good, so what can we do?"

Hayley then went onto explain that Tahbilk is actively taking steps to reduce their carbon footprint (so far by 25%) but I'd just like to stop at... "So what can **we** do?"

Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> May @ 7pm Seymour Library, Anzac Avenue, Seymour


