OK, so while the body is back in Victoria, the head is still in Tasmania and I can't help wondering, when it comes to the environment, how we can continue to get it so wrong. If Gustav Weindorfer could clearly see in 1910 that there are some environmental areas that should be preserved for posterity, "This should be a National Park for all time. It is magnificent and people must know about it and enjoy it," (Cradle) then why can't we, with all the understanding and knowledge of the natural world, that has been accrued in the last 100 years, see that today? On one of our 4 days in Tasi we drove from Cradle to Stanley along the "back roads." I was amazed at the quality of the road network that seemed to be way off the beaten track and then realised that we were driving through mile after mile of plantation timber. Pine and blue gum stands sat side by side over a fair chunk of the north west and I lost count of the number of logging trucks, passing us in both directions. A wood-chipping operation was making short work of some of their loads, but other logs were destined for further afield. It is obviously an industry vital to the Tasmanian economy and if they can learn from the carefully farmed plantation experiences of the Canadian and Finnish timber industries then it will have a sustainable future. What concerns me though is their propensity to continue to needlessly log old growth forests, such as the Tarkine and the Styx, where the damage being done to these precious and unique environments is irrevocable and the loss of habitat criminal. Such an irreversible situation obviously touched a chord with one of our TGN readers last week and his vertiginous contribution is on page 3 for all to read and enjoy, thanks Sandy.

climbing back up the hill while watching out for the white bull. The last leg of our walk was along Highlands Road back to our cars. Thanks to the owners of the properties we walked though and to Dennis Spiteri for the photos. Memories of Federation Peak & Lake Pedder

Many years ago I was with a school party that climbed Federation Peak in Jan 1958 by the direct exposed route - see photo at right. We were the first group to do so in perfectly clear weather and, I think, the fourth only after the first summiteers in 1949. We did have a rope but didn't use it! This was incredibly scary for a 17 year old but one just had to face the wall and never



look down between one's legs as you can see. Even more scary was the narrow path along the lower face, again with the drop below, to get to the Hanging Lake - as we had to walk sideways with our packs on and not look down. So much for occupational health and safety in the 1950s!

But the most memorable, unique and the saddest experience of the trip was camping on the brilliant white sand of Lake Pedder, after climbing Federation Peak, and walking into the shallows of the caramel coloured water surrounded by the crags and dramatic peaks of the Franklin Range. All in perfect sunshine. We were so privileged to walk along the beautiful, pristine beach of Lake Pedder because sadly, 12 years later, the Tasmanian Government revoked the Lake Pedder National Park and the Tasmanian Hydroelectricity Commission flooded this magnificent lake in the

wilderness and the beach is now under 10 metres of water.



Lake Pedder, I believe, is the worst case of economic vandalism and unrecoverable destruction of our natural environment that our country has experienced!

But Lake Pedder has also left an enduring legacy of a much enhanced community and political

appreciation, and preparedness, to preserve and protect Australia's natural resource and environment.

Vale, but thank you, Lake Pedder.
