Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

The forthcoming week, 17th -23rd June, is National Refugee Week. Whatever your opinion of our country's mandatory detention policy, according to the OED (Oxford English Dictionary) a **refugee** is - a person taking refuge, especially in a foreign country, from religious or political prosecution or from war, earthquake, etc.

Under this definition there are 13,299 people, including 4059 children, currently living in Australia, who have been legally deemed to be refugees. And if you choose to access the Website of the Week below (a link from the Asylum Seekers' Resource Centre's CEO that explains the new laws, as of 18th June) you can discover the current state of play. This situation has just taken another plummet into poverty, for these fellow Australians to be, as they now wait until 2020 for the opportunity for their asylum application to finally be processed. Throughout Australia many country towns and localities have become part of the Rural Australians for Refugees movement with its aim of compassionate treatment of Australia's Asylum Seekers - there are 42 groups in Victoria alone. The RAR group in Strathbogie Shire at Euroa is holding a fundraising film night this coming Wednesday 20th June to raise funds to provide practical support (food, clothing, accommodation) to local refugees. If you would like to assist this humanitarian cause, tickets are \$16/\$12, with pre movie snacks at 6pm and curtain up at 6.30. See p.3 for further details.



Mobile Library - Book Review

Sunburnt Country by Joelle Gergis

This book is a very interesting insight into, not only the current state of the weather affecting Australia, but also the history of Australian climate. From the diary and journal entries of the First Fleet - they arrived in the middle of an El Nino weather pattern, which probably didn't



help much with the planting and harvesting of the introduced seeds - to tree rings, slices of coral and ice cores, this fascinating book details the history of formal, informal and natural weather records. It explores the highs and lows of climate over the millennia and scientifically justifies the fact that climate change is a reality and that human intervention has escalated its progress. Gergis has presented a compelling argument using an extensive range of resources. It is truly amazing the extent that scientists use documents and samples to verify & confirm the impact of climate change on our planet. A very readable and informative book.

What is the Difference?

A **refugee** is forced to flee from their country and cannot return unless the situation that forced them to leave improves. Some are forced to flee without any warning: many have experienced trauma and torture. The motivating factor for refugees is safety and protection from persecution and human rights abuse, not economic advantage.

An **asylum seeker** is a person who is seeking protection as a refugee and is still waiting to have his/her claim assessed. Every refugee has at some point been an asylum seeker.

A **migrant** is somebody who leaves their country to have a better life. They choose where they migrate to and they are able to return whenever they like.

Reuse, Recycle & Refuse Tips #1

Did you know that tops should be removed from bottles before putting them in the bin as the tops are usually made from different materials? But because loose tops and small bits of plastic "fall through the cracks" they cause problems. The solution is to use a clean, empty metal can (soup, baked beans, etc) to put the metal bottle tops in - crush them a bit and when the tin is nearly full, squeeze the sides together, so no tops will fall out and put into your recycle bin.

Put plastic tops (orange juice, milk, bread tags, etc) into a plastic container - clean butter or margarine tub - put the lid on when full and also place into the recycle bin.
