Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

Winter has well and truly descended on the plateau and snow is a definite possibility if the temperatures keep on dropping into the minuses at night and although it has been raining, Alistair Lade - Highlands' rainfall recorder, advises that so far the rain result for the last 6 months is 85mm less than the average. Something to ponder for the summer.

With NAIDOC Week finishing up as I type I thought it might be interesting to share a little bit about the land, country, on which we live. Firstly, our homes are situated on Taungurung land and these tribal lands encompass a huge chunk of Victoria - the boundaries include the towns and settlements of Woods Point, Mt Buller, Euroa, Rushworth, Heathcote, Kyneton, Pyalong, and along the Kinglake Range to Marysville. Within the Taungurung tribal lands there were 9 clans and the clan that roamed our part of the bigger picture were known as the Waring-Yilam-bulok. Of the 9 clans in existence when European settlement began only 5 of these clan groups have descendants living today. Traditionally the Taungurung lived a hunter/gatherer existence and the various clans migrated on a seasonal basis utilising the resources available in the vast country. Taungurung ancestors had an intimate knowledge of their environment and were able to sustain the ecology of the local area and exploit the food available. Mirnong (Yam Daisy) was a staple plant food and a reliable source of carbohydrate. Other plants such as Bracken Fern (food & medicine), Tree Ferns, Kangaroo Apple and Cherry Balert were also valuable food sources and can still be seen growing on Taungurung country today. The rich resources of the permanent rivers and creeks yielded an abundance of fish and other wildlife such as Marram (Kangaroo), Goorbil (Koala) and Barramul (Emu) also provided nourishing food. STRATHBOGIE SHIRE PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of the preparation of an amendment

Amendment C78

The Strathbogie Shire Council has prepared Amendment C78 to the Strathbogie Planning Scheme.

The land affected by the amendment is the entire municipality of Strathbogie Shire, with particular relevance to township and urban areas.

The amendment proposes to implement the recommendations of the Strathbogie Shire Electronic Gaming Machine Policy Statement, June 2016, by including strategic guidance in the Municipal Strategic Statement at Clause 21.05 and inserting a new Local Policy at Clause 22.04 to ensure that electronic gaming facilities are located in appropriate locations within the municipality.

The proposed amendment:

- Amends Clause 21.05 to provide strategic guidance to proponents as recommended by the Strathbogie Gaming Amendment Discussion Paper 2018.
- Amends Clause 21.08 to include the Strathbogie Shire Electronic Gaming Machine Policy Statement, June 2016 as a reference document in the scheme.

Inserts Clause 22.04 to provide further policy direction to decision makers in determining the appropriate siting of electronic gaming facilities.

You may inspect the amendment, any documents that support the amendment and the explanatory report about the amendment, free of charge, at the following locations:

§ during office hours, at the office of the planning authority, Strathbogie Shire Council <u>109A Binney St</u>, <u>Euroa VIC</u> <u>3666</u>.

§ at the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning website www.delwp.vic.gov.au/public-inspection.

Any person who may be affected by the amendment may make a submission to the planning authority about the amendment. Submissions must be made in writing giving the submitter's name and contact address, clearly stating the grounds on which the amendment is supported or opposed and indicating what changes (if any) the submitter wishes to make.

Name and contact details of submitters are required for council to consider submissions and to notify such persons of the opportunity to attend council meetings and any public hearing held to consider submissions. The closing date for submissions is close of business **3rd August 2018**. A submission must be sent to the Strathbogie Shire Council **109A Binney St, Euroa VIC 3666**.

The planning authority must make a copy of every submission available at its office for any person to inspect free of charge for two months after the amendment comes into operation or lapses.
