#### Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

Since taking on the position of Editor of TGN I have tried to ensure a selection of articles from all areas of the catchment. Not surprisingly Highlands and Ruffy items have predominated, with their 'huge' population bases (it's all relative), although I must say that there's obviously a very active social life in Terip. This week though I'm delighted to include the first contribution from a Whitehead's Creek resident, thank you Lesley, and I hope that you enjoy reading about the delightful inhabitants of the tree hollows and fallen branches of our local area. As we're now on the downhill run to spring all sorts of activities are starting to appear in TGN (see p.3) - from Rogaining to the Ruffy Artfest to Refugees, so read on.....

And **Kenny**? - was exploring the Black Market mushroom options.

#### Wildlife in Whitehead's Creek

In some parts of the district, we are lucky enough to still have significant native vegetation that provides habitat for some of our remaining wildlife, from **Koalas**, and **Goannas**, to **Echidnas**, **Sugar Gliders** and **Antechinus**.

This is amazing, in 2018, when you think about it. There are huge old gum trees, some hundreds of years old but still standing strong, often with hollows that provide home for the creatures we share our world with. Even if they are hollow, these old trees still have many years ahead of them as their walls are strong, and designed to last. On the ground there are fallen branches and sticks. In the paddocks these fallen branches and sticks might still provide shelter for the **Bush Stone Curlew**. The Curlew is well camouflaged, and with short grass (grazing sheep can help with this) the Curlew is able to see if a predator approaching. Control of Foxes helps these birds. I have been lucky enough to hear their eerie cry three times in Whitehead's Creek, and I believe they are still to be found here.

People like to collect firewood along the roads, and as long as they collect a fallen branch that is not hollow, I have not seen this as a serious problem though admittedly I've only been observing it for 45 years. A hollow log provides habitat for our native friends. And stumps provide habitat for Antechinus. I have had an Antechinus on my veranda, and just for an instant, you might mistake it for a mouse. They also live on the roadside at our gate, and in our neighbour's cattle yards. There are stumps for them to live in. They are carnivorous, and the little birds know them and sound the alarm.



This time of year people love to clean up fallen wood on their farms and roadsides, for fire preparedness and also to collect wood to warm the house. It is really good to leave a bit of wood for our animals, especially hollow branches and stumps. The joy of seeing these unusual species right on one's doorstep is reward enough. - Lesley Dalziel

#### Dark Emu - Bruce Pascoe

Bunurong elder Bruce Pascoe's book "Dark Emu - Black Seeds: agriculture or accident?" was nominated for and won a slew of literary awards, when it was first published in 2014. It has been reprinted 14 times due to the fact it is an amazingly good and enlightening read. It introduces the reader to Australian History as we were never taught at school, when any history lessons started about 1770 with James Cook sailing up the east coast of Australia. This book fills in quite a few gaps in our knowledge of the indigenous way of life, over millennia, including the fact

that aboriginal settlements were stable, agricultural communities that farmed the land, stored grain, created incredible fish traps and cooked bread. Pascoe has used primary sources from both European explorers and settlers to great effect.

The 43rd Victorian Rogaining Championships are to be held on 22-23 September 2018 near Strathbogie and will feature a 24 -hour event with a mix of elite, regular and social participants. There is also a 6-hour rogaine on the Saturday afternoon with a
