

Although Bryson is an American he has lived most of his life in Britain and his writing style reflects this combination of influences. Overwhelming he has written travel books and he style is informative, humorous and extremely diverting. **Down Under** is an oldie but a goldie, as it was written earlier this century, but is still in print. Rogaining is for Everyone - so why not be in it?

We are starting our next phase of preparation for the 43rd Victorian Rogaining Championships which involves placing a coloured marker with an electronic pen at all 70 control locations. Some markers are in forest and others in farmland. We are very happy to show people what these are and how they work, but we would ask that the ones that we place are not touched, please. All these markers and pens will be collected on 24-25September once the event is complete.

As well as the 24-hour Championships, we have a 6-hour event starting at noon on **Saturday 22nd September**. Novices are welcome in both events, but many might find the 6-hour the ideal occasion to try out a navigation sport and enjoy the forest and farmland of the plateau. Each team can choose their own route and our experienced rogainers can offer advice before or after the start. There is no compulsion to complete any set course and points are earned for each control that is visited.

As a wholesome outdoor activity, rogaining has a strong focus on appreciating and caring for the natural environment, teamwork, self-reliance and leadership skills. Scouts, cadets, outdoor education groups and schools enter teams in many rogaines, and some organisations have been supporting their young adults to attend for the last decade or more.

Details are available from <u>vra.rogaine.asn.au</u> where the nature of the sport is explained. On the website you will find guidance as to how you can enter, basic requirements, and some tips for novices. You can also access the association's insurance policy, our updated biosecurity policy, the history of the sport, guidelines for our event managers and photos of previous events.

As we set this course we have been lucky enough to visit some wonderful places, and I see some amazing geology. Once the event is over and we have completed the tidy-up, I have agreed to lead a community session on the geology either as a presentation or an outdoor walk.
