E-waste is a growing concern

Murrindindi Shire Council is inviting residents and business owners across the Shire to join in the effort to reduce e-waste going into landfill. E-waste is any item with a plug, battery or cord that is no longer working or wanted, and it's one of the fastest growing categories of waste worldwide. Currently, more than one million mobile phones and 1.5 million TVs are discarded in Australia every year. It is estimated that for televisions and computers alone, the amount of e-waste generated in Australia will grow to 223,000 tonnes in 2023-24, an increase of more than 60 percent since 2012-13. To try and increase the amount of e-waste that gets recycled instead of sent to landfill, Murrindindi Shire Council is teaming up with Sustainability Victoria to tackle the problem by making sure residents understand what e-waste is and how they can dispose of it properly. To protect our environment and work toward recovering more resources from recyclable products, the Victorian Government will ban all e-waste from landfill from 1 July 2019. With today's unprecedented pace in technology upgrades, we are unfortunately living in an increasingly disposable age. Even larger electrical items are discarded with far greater frequency than a generation ago. It's vital that we get on board with this campaign as many of these items contain hazardous materials such as lead, mercury, phosphor, arsenic, fluids and refrigerants. If waste is not properly managed, these materials can leach into groundwater and soil, or release into the air, creating long term contamination issues and human health issues. As well as these hazardous materials, there are a range of non-renewable materials, such as copper, silver, palladium and gold, used in the production of electronic and electrical goods. These valuable materials are lost to recovery and future reuse once in landfill. It's important we understand that there are some extremely useful and valuable materials contained within these devices, however broken or obsolete, that can be recycled and reused. In fact, 90 percent of e-waste is recyclable it just has to be taken to the right place & there are special e-waste collection bins at MSC's Resource Recovery Centres. Wildlife to Wellbeing Project

Deakin University, in collaboration with Land for Wildlife, is seeking volunteers to participate in a citizen science project called Wildlife to Wellbeing, which will trial new camera technology to monitor and identify wildlife on properties registered with the Land For Wildlife program in Victoria. This is an exciting opportunity to be part of a project that will test new video technology developed at Deakin University, and deployed on this project for the first time anywhere in the world. The technology enables 24-hour, continual monitoring of wildlife that will capture video of a greater proportion of animals in the vicinity than existing wildlife camera technologies. The cameras will operate for up to three months from the time of set up in January/February 2019. Deakin will collect the cameras at the end of the project to reuse in future projects. To participate, your property needs to have heathy dry forest or grassy dry forest ecological vegetation classes (EVC's).

You may qualify if your property is located in central Victoria, within the rough area of Bacchus Marsh-Ballarat-Ararat-Maryborough-Dunolly -Bendigo-Elmore-Rushworth-Seymour-Yea- St Andrews-Whittlesea-Sunbury. Like to be a part of
