They have just popped up like mushrooms from an unknown source.





Such explorations can apply to every aspect of our lives, how we relate to each other, how we do our work, how we view the social, moral and political issues of our day. The problem arises when we get too stuck in the old answers we have lived with and stop asking questions.

Consider our voting habits, consider the way we view people who are different to ourselves, consider the way we use technology, consider even the way we view ourselves. Perhaps at times, we need to question why we are so hard on ourselves and on others. Maybe it's a question of why we act as if we are always so right!

Even God is a question to be pondered.

Let's hear it for the Lace Monitor

Those of you who read the back page of TGN may have noticed that the Friends of the Powerful Owl have now transferred their allegiance to a new animal for 2018—Lace Monitor or Tree Goanna—and we thank them for that.

As space permits I will enlighten you with some seriously interesting facts about this large reptile. So let's start....The lace monitor or tree goanna (Varanus varius – meaning many coloured lizard) is a member of the monitor lizard family, Australian members of which are commonly known as goannas. Lace monitors are the second-largest monitor in Australia after the perentie.

In Australia, monitors are more commonly called goannas, a name given by early settlers in the mistaken belief that they were related to iguanas.

Another well-known member of this family is the enormous Komodo Dragon, Varanus komodoen-

sis, which lives only on 4 small Indonesian islands northwest of Australia. This monster can grow up to 3 m long (10 ft)!



All monitor lizards are powerfully built, with strong limbs and long, sharp curved claws. The head is pointed and wedge-shaped. The body is slender in young animals, but older goannas accumulate layers of fat and become quite rotund!
