VALE - Stephen Hawking (1942-2018)

This week was a sad week; the world lost a great thinker Stephen Hawking. In memory of this I would like to share a couple of his thoughts that don't relate to Physics but to challenges that we face.

He once said, "How will we feed an ever-growing population, provide clean water, generate renewable energy, prevent and cure diseases and slow down global climate change. I hope that science and technology will provide the answers to these questions. But it will take people, human beings with knowledge and understanding to implement the solution.'

He also had a simple message about what we learned from the space age, "When we see the earth from space we see ourselves as a whole, we see the unity and not the divisions. One planet, one human race".

I sometimes fear that many don't agree with these simple messages. The current and growing attitude to the pursuit of knowledge is to undermine or distrust it - scientists aren't believed, they are ridiculed for having self-interest or for being elitist. Our politicians now specialise in creating fear and divisions to win elections, I believe the term used is "wedge politics".

I hope that in the not too distant future these attitudes do change, and we begin to see that all we have is one small R.I.P Stephen Hawking planet and we are all one race.
