#### **PEOPLE AND PLACES**

### Longwood - Mansfield Rd Signs

Have you notice any of these signs in your area?

These signs mark roadsides with populations of the Euroa Guinea Flower and have been erected as part of the National Recovery Plan for this species.

The Euroa Guinea-flower (Hibbertia humifusa subspecies erigens) is listed as Vulnerable under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999, and is listed as threatened under the Victorian Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988. The taxon is endemic to north-eastern Victoria, where about 16 populations containing several thousand plants occur. Many populations occur along roadsides and on private land, and are at great risk. Major threats include weed invasion, grazing and lack of regeneration, road-widening and altered fire regimes. This national Recovery Plan for the Euroa Guineaflower details the species' distribution and biology, conservation status, threats, and recovery objectives and actions necessary to ensure its longterm survival. ## BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

### Buff-banded Rail Gallirallus philippensis

I was driving through Terip one morning a few weeks ago when I saw an unusual bird by the side of the road. Its mottled plumage first made me think quail, but it was a bit too large and as it scurried into the long grass I realised the shape was that of a crake or rail. I was surprised, as these birds usually live in reeds by ponds or streams and have a reputation for being shy and secretive. However I checked a few books and they confirm the buff banded rail will come out into the open to feed from grubs and insects in mud or grassland, ducking back into the undergrowth when disturbed.

## PROPOSED CHANGES TO FLORA AND FAUNA GUARANTEE ACT

"Some of you may be aware that the Victorian Government is proposing to change the rules on when and where the Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act applies in timber harvesting areas. This is the Act that is meant to give legal protection to Victoria's threatened species

The proposed variation will allow the Secretary of the Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) to override a Flora and Fauna Guarantee Action Statement for any given forest coupe/s. In other words, it empowers the Secretary to clear threatened species habitat that would otherwise have been protected.


