PEOPLE AND PLACES

Councillor Comment, Cr Cris Ruhr, King Parrot Ward The Shape of Our Future

As the third year anniversary commemorating the date of 7 February 2009 approached, there was a near tangible cautious tone in our household.

I discovered with little wonder, as I moved about the local community, that this impression was corresponding with the general and public mood at this time

What did make me wonder however, was the fact that those living here and passing one another in the main street, or meeting in the local shops appeared to openly display kindness, a respectful acceptance and even what could be described as a 'comfortable easiness' with one another in regards to emotions; whether openly displayed or reservedly veiled.

Whether we like it or not, and whether we appear to have moved on or not, and whether we share a similar or a different approach to what befell us, my observations led me to also explore how the effects of disaster, whether the cause be natural, technological or criminal, exclusively leaves its mark.

Will we be comfortable to be ultimately defined by our disaster?

How do the people affected by the Chernobyl disaster feel nowadays by what must be an automatic or default reaction to their town's name?

New Orleans' residents must face (repetitive and challenging) questions about Hurricane Katrina.

The Balinese quickly understood their tourism-based livelihoods would be everlastingly tarred by the bombings.

The Japan experience has been constantly compared to Chernobyl; which sadly may reduce the importance of their disaster encounter and I suppose this could leave people feeling less acknowledged.

Nearer to our home turf, the devastating floods have had a great impact upon us all. Empathy seems to flow freely and without shame when our mates are affected so greatly. What I have also come to understand is that although we had no say in what occurred and really no choice in the matter which was way beyond our control, we now actually can have a say and can have a choice.

Do we allow our experience to define us and how we are perceived, and for generations to come? Or, do we stand together and work out ways to help drive and shape our future?

At a memorial service in Kinglake West, I was heartened to hear the words of our children, extolling the virtues of our community and the people who live here, clearly showing the love that they have for where they live and expressing a desire for a wonderful future.

Whilst we may have all celebrated the beginning of 2012 and the beginning of the Year of the Dragon, for many the New Year truly starts on 8 February of every year.

Thoughts can be unwelcome at this time after a disaster; yet the beginnings of any contemplation surrounding any sort of future may just mean there is something to hope for, which is a bit more than I felt capable of around our second anniversary.

BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

Grey shrike thrush Colluricincla harmonica

This bird is common around the district and is known for its beautiful song. You may not have seen them but you've almost certainly heard and enjoyed them. It's not uncommon for them to build their round nests of bark and twigs in buildings or under verandahs. This spring we had a pair build a nest in a toolbox on a shelf just inside our tool shed door. They successfully raised two broods.

They mainly eat insects and grubs.
