Bunk Beds for Burmese Orphans

Joy Purcell, from Yea, visited Burma with Jenny Webb in 2010 and 2011. One of the children's homes she visited was struggling to accommodate the ever increasing number of children needing care. Some of these children are 'war orphans' from conflict zones in the country, others are from the delta area which was devastated by Cyclone Nargis in 2008.

The 200 children at the home are housed in three dormitories, sharing a long wooden platform to sleep each night. Joy was so touched by their situation that she is raising money to build bunk beds for the children, to ease the crowded sleeping conditions and to give them 'a space' of their own.

With the support of GraceWorks Myanmar and the Yea Rotary Club, Joy is running a raffle to finish the bunk bed project which she began last year. Raffle tickets are available from the Highlands Primary School, \$2.00 ea or 3 for \$5.00. Joy is aiming to raise \$3000 and has a beautiful 'ABC' quilt made by Yea UFO Club as first prize, a horse-shoe garden table made by Daryl Callander as second prize and a basket of Lanocreme Skin Care products as third prize. Fourth prize is a hand-woven Burmese Longyi, a traditional garment worn by both men and women in Burma. It will be drawn on the 28/3/12 at 2pm at the Pioneer reserve, Yea.

Highlands PS has a very special relationship with this orphanage. For the last 5 years, the students have sent books, videos and letters to the Burmese children and the home has been visited by Highlands teachers. Your support will be much appreciated. Large-leaf Bush-pea Pultenaea daphnoides

This attractive shrub is one of those that has been planted between the red bottlebrushes that replaced the pines in front of the Highlands hall. It grows locally around Ruffy and Creightons Creek though I haven't seen it around Highlands. It can grow to 2 or 3 metres and has clusters of red-centred yellow pea flowers at the end of branches.

TASHI LHUNPO MONKS TO VISIT ALEXANDRA

The Tashi Lhunpo Monks of Tibet are masters of Tibetan Buddhist tantric ritual and their lives are dedicated to practicing tantric ideals. The Tashi Lhunpo Monks living in exile in India have regularly participated in tours of Australia with well-known Tibetan musician Tenzin Choegyal. They offer a cultural program of traditional Tibetan creative arts including Sand Mandala creation, Harmonic Chanting, Tibetan Singing, Cultural Workshops, Guided Meditations and the "For Tibet With Love" Concert.

Tour programs aim to share some of the most distinctive aspects of Tibetan culture with the people of Australia and promote the common human values of kindness and compassion through cross cultural connections.

The For Tibet With Love Australian Tour raises funds for the education of Tibetan Children as well as supporting the Tashi Lhunpo Monastery. This is a unique opportunity to experience the gift of beautiful music and unique culture while at the same time providing valuable humanitarian assistance.

Tashi Lhunpo Monastery was founded in Tibet by His Holiness the 1st Dalai Lama, Gyalwa Gendun Drup, in 1447. It was one of four great monasteries of Central Tibet overseen by the Dalai Lamas and Panchen Lamas and has produced thousands of renowned scholars in the field of Mahayana Buddhist Philosophy.

After the Chinese invasion of Tibet in 1959, Tashi Lhunpo Monastery was reestablished at Bylakuppe in South India in 1972. The monastery accommodates monks from Tibet and Himalayan regions such as Spithi, Khunu, Ladakh, Ghashar and Sangkhar. At present there are over 250 monks including many Tulkus (reincarnate lamas).

The monks follow an intensive program of study including sutra, tantra and debate, and are instructed in the creation of sand mandalas and butter sculpture, ritual performance, music, chanting, dance and basic literacy skills in Tibetan and English. Each monk must also complete a two to three month meditation retreat for each of the principal deities and protectors, in order to qualify to perform their rituals. The cycle of retreats can take up to six years to complete.

For Tibet With Love Concert: The concert includes chanting and monastic dance by the monks accompanied by traditional instruments, followed by a performance by singer-songwriter Tenzin Choegyal.

FOX AND RABBIT BAITING

The Month of March is a good time to think about baiting pest animals such as foxes and rabbits. Baiting will not only target the adult foxes, but also their young as they are usually active from their dens at this time.

Wales Rural in Seymour can supply baits such as DeFox and Fox Off (you may need to order as they are not usually kept in stock) and the signs associated with baiting.

Pindone bait for rabbits is also available 5Kg approx cost \$80.

You will need a permit to be able to purchase any bait that contains 1080, and signs and notification to neighboring properties is required.


