KOALAS AT TERIP AND RUFFY

(Article taken from the Euroa 'Gazette'/ Advertiser 18th April 1944- reprinted in: Ruffy Pioneers Past and Present- The Ruffy History preservation Committee 2011)

On Friday afternoon, residents of Ruffy and Terip Terip had the opportunity of watching the liberation of koala bears in their district. Thirty two koalas were transported from Quail Island. Placed in special crates, each of which held four bears, the koalas arrived in a motor vehicle, under the care of Mr Green, Inspector of the Fisheries and Game Department. He was assisted by a local honorary inspector, Mr Bon Noye.

The bears were liberated in groups of eight, one group near the Ruffy township, one near the Ruffy- Terip Terip Presbyterian church, one at the reserve near the church and the fourth group at Creightons Creek. Quite a number of residents and school children attended the various places to view these interesting little animals. While the bears were awaiting release near the church a koala was observed sleeping in a tree directly above the spot. It was one of the bears that had been released two years previously.

The method of liberation is very simple. The door of the crate is placed towards a tree, and when it is opened, the bear immediately ambles to the trunk and very quickly he is perched in the topmost branches. The bears released on Friday, were all fine specimens, and it is hoped that they will thrive in their new habitation. They would certainly provide an added attraction to this district.

BEEF CATTLE DAY ASSESSED THE OPTIONS

Beef cattle appear to be the preferred animal enterprise opportunity currently according to a 'mini survey' conducted at the recent "Elements of Livestock Care" workshop sponsored by the Seymour Agricultural & Pastoral Society.

Attendees at the workshop voted cattle as their preferred interest over sheep or alternative animal enterprises.

The Workshop held at the historic Worrough property of the Miller family at Trawool attracted over twenty local hobby or small acreage farmers from the local area.

Attendees heard wide ranging presentations on livestock care, the management of pastures and biodiversity projects, livestock marketing and veterinary care of livestock.

Key presenters included DPI officers Jane Court and Brad Costin while Janet Hagen represented the Strathbogie Conservation Management Network.

Finally Seymour based veterinarians John Dalziel and Andrew Hogan provided practical demonstrations on pregnancy testing and animal welfare.



The historic Worrough property on Greenslopes Road at Trawool was purchased by Hugh Miller and his family fifty years ago. Now 1,100 acres and about one third Goulburn River flats and one third granite hill country the property was once a station of about 28,000 acres.

And as one of the earliest selections in the Trawool district part of the original homestead can be traced back to about 1842. In fact the original timber shingle roof of the first section of the homestead is preserved under corrugated iron. A further section of the house was added about 1890 and then an even further addition much later. Worrough is recorded by the National Trust and is thus one of the earliest homesteads still in use in the Upper Goulburn district.

BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

Small Brown Birds

The Euroa Birdwatchers visited Ruffy this week to check out the bird life in our riparian forest. The group (Betty, Ann and Jill) were delighted with the number of 'small brown birds' using this area.

Before lunch the bush was alive with birds foraging in the bark hanging from the mountain swamp gums and amongst the tea-tree thickets. After lunch the wind sprung up and the smaller birds disappeared, apparently this is the normal pattern on bird watching afternoons.

Our list included: Yellow-faced honeyeaters, White-eared honeyeaters, Black-chinned honeyeaters, Brown headed honeyeaters, (I can see a pattern here!) Red wattlebird, Grey fantail, Blue wren, White-throated tree creeper, Golden whistler, Grey thrush, Flame robin, Yellow rumped thornbill, Striated thornbill, Yellow thornbill ... These small brown birds are very colourful.
