### FIFTH RUFFY ART SHOW AND SALE WITH OPEN GARDENS

#### TO BE HELD IN NOVEMBER

The Fifth Biennial Ruffy Art Show and Sale is on at the Ruffy Community Hall on the weekend of the 10 and 11 November from 10am to 5 pm both days. Entry is \$5.00. Entries from artists are still being accepted for the show until Friday November 2. (See www.ruffycommunity.com.au or phone 5790 4318 for an entry form.)

The Art Show will commence with the popular 'Meet the Artists' preview on Friday 9 November at 7.00 pm. This is an opportunity to mingle with some of the artists who have entered their artwork in the show and get in early to purchase a favoured piece of art. The usual delicious array of locally made finger food and wines will again be available to enjoy. Tickets for the preview are \$15 and are available on 5790 4318.

During the weekend there will be most popular painting competition, a raffle, activities to keep the kids amused and light refreshments available to enjoy.

Three Ruffy Gardens will be OPEN from 10am – 4 pm on both Saturday and Sunday during the Art Show.

### 'Coolalie' McLeans Lane

A beautiful remake to an old setting. Wide verandahs for entertaining with vistas into a park-like setting. This garden created by ABC presenter Caroline Blackman of Vivid Designs features copses of well-grown birch and Manchurian pear trees, walled gardens and roses set amongst older established trees. As this garden matures it reflects the designer's vision.

### 'Greenwood Park' Maggies Lane

Approached by a winding drive, with distant vistas framed by Stone Pines propagated 25 years ago from cones collected in Malvern's Hedgely Dene Gardens, Greenwood Park's secret garden reveals itself to delight the visitor

Evolving over the years, the garden rambles in a profusion of bulbs, perennials, shrubs and trees from around the world. From the welcoming Chestnuts, the exotic Iranian Parrotia tree, the Indian Bean tree, to the English Mulberry and apple orchard, to peonies, irises, salvias and columbines, Greenwood's garden enchants the senses and constantly surprises.

### 'Parrindi' Weibye Track

A long entrance lined with Castlewellan gold cypress and an ornamental lake leads to a circular driveway incorporating a copse of cut leaf birches in front of the garden gate. This large garden comprises a series of garden rooms and pathways with camellias, rhododendrons, lilacs, topiaries, a formal rose garden and a superb laburnum archway in full flower. The outdoor BBQ area features the original homestead's kitchen fireplace made of local stone. A large potager garden with a separate orchard where chooks wander completes the picture.

Follow the signposts and flags and balloons will be at each Garden entrance.

Cost is \$5 pp each garden or \$10 for all three

Proceeds from this year's event will go towards the Ruffy Community Hall Art project.

## CULT DISCUSSION AT ALEXANDRA LIBRARY

Soapbox at the Alexandra Library is an opportunity for debate and discussion around edgy interesting topics.
Soapbox on Wednesday 7 November from 7pm will be about cults.

Author Raphael Aaron will share his expertise on this topic and lead an evening of lively discussion.

Brainwashing has become almost a household word in the last two decades or so. In 1961 after studying the effects of mind control on American prisoners of war under the Communist Chinese, Robert J. Lifton wrote the definitive book on the subject, Thought Reform and the Psychology of Totalism.

Lifton lists eight major factors used to identify whether a group is a destructive cult or not. He suggests that any authoritarian religion should be held up to the light in order to determine how destructive their influence is on their members.

Raphael Aaron is the author of Cults: Too good to be true. This is an invaluable guide to family and friends who are concerned about the involvement of a loved one in a cult. Similarly it is an important book for community leaders and clergymen who seek a deeper understanding of the phenomena of cultism. # COUNCIL FIRE RESTRICTION PERIOD STARTS

Murrindindi Shire Council's fire restriction period has started which means property owners wanting to reduce fuel loads must obtain a permit to burn.

Council's General Manager Sustainability Michael Chesworth said it was important people continued to actively reduce fuel loads on properties but they must follow the guidelines under the fire restriction period.

Council's 'Fire Amnesty' period in residential areas has ceased and no burning off will be permitted in any residential or rural area without a permit.

"If you are planning a burn off you are required to obtain a permit, unless it complies with a range of criteria. This also applies to the burning of windrows," Mr Chesworth said.

During the municipal restriction period, residents should contact the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer (MFPO) Andrew Daly, to discuss their situation and an inspection can be arranged for a permit to be issued.

"It is very important that residents, landholders and visitors obey the fire restriction period. People who light fires without permits can face fines of up to \$2,000 given the significant risk fire posed to life and property," Mr Chesworth said.

Council will start property inspections in and around settlement areas in mid November to ensure owners have completed fire prevention works.

"It is important that everyone plays a role in fire prevention," Mr Chesworth said. "Failure by owners to maintain their property could lead to enforcement action."

During the fire restriction period, permits are required in rural areas to burnoff any tree, stump, log or vegetation in excess of 75mm (3 inches) in diameter.

Permits are not required for the burning of stubble grass, bracken or vegetation under 75mm (3 inches).

The municipal fire restriction period will end at the commencement of the CFA's Declared Fire Danger Period which will be determined by the Country Fire Authority.

"It is important to note that after the commencement of the CFA Declared Fire Danger Period no permits to burn will be issued by Council," Mr Chesworth said. People wanting more information on permits should contact Murrindindi Shire Council on 5772 0376.
