#### A STICKY WEED PROBLEM!!

CATCHWEED/BEDSTRAW/ CLEAVERS (Galium aparine)

Catchweed bedstraw (Galium aparine) is an annual weed that can be found throughout most of the world. It is known by many names including cleavers, bedstraw, stickywilly, and "sticky weed.". It is often an early colonizer of waste places, roadsides, and other disturbed sites; however, it also can be a major weed of crops such as cereals and hay as well as in the home and vegetable gardens.

Mature "sticky weed" has stems up to 6 feet long that are square in profile, especially near the tips. It often forms dense, tangled mats that sprawl on the ground or over other vegetation. Leaves are whorled and small, downward-curved prickles cover both the stem and leaves. These hairlike structures are responsible for the characteristic tangled growth habit and attachment of plant parts to clothing and animals; they also aid in dispersal. Small, four-parted, white or greenishwhite flowers are borne on the upper part of the plant

"Sticky weed" has a slender taproot and sprawling stems, and can tolerate freezing temperatures while in the vegetative growth stage. This fast growing weed can flower in as little as eight weeks after germination; the flowers are self-pollinated and usually set seed in late spring to mid-summer. Individual plants typically produce 100 to 400 seeds, with some plants producing 3,000 or more seeds. The seeds can remain viable in the soil for up to three years.

#### Control

Long-term control relies on removing existing plants before they flower and produce viable seed. Hand hoeing or weed pulling can be very effective, especially in the early spring when soil is damp.

#### A FERAL FEAST- CHINESE STYLE CHILLI RABBIT

(Recipe taken from www.bestrecipes.com.au)

500g Rabbit pieces, washed 2 tbs oil 1 ½ tbs fermented black beans, mashed 1 ½ tbs soy 1 tbs sugar ½ tsp salt ½ tsp Sichuan peppercorns crushed 3 tbs chilli oil 4 spring onions finely chopped

STOCK 2 spring onions 2 slices of ginger 1 tbs rice wine 1 tbs soy sauce 600ml water

Boil rabbit pieces in water for 5 minutes, remove rinse and discard water.

Pour the ingredients for the stock into a pan and add rabbit pieces, bring to the boil, cover and simmer until the rabbit is cooked (approx. 40 mins).

Remove the rabbit from the stock, allow to cool and shred the meat from the bones.

Heat the oil in the wok and stir fry the black beans for 30 seconds, add soy sauce, sugar, salt and pepper, chilli oil and the shredded rabbit. Mix together quickly over high heat and serve immediately, garnished with the spring onions From Simone Ulstrup
