BITS OF BOTANY AND BIRDS

MISTLETOE - Friend or Foe?

Here's some of what the DSE's Revegetation Guide for the Goulburn-Broken Catchment has to say.

Mistletoe as Habitat

Mistletoe is particularly valuable habitat. Mistletoe is a rich nectar source, often at times when other nectar is scarce, during summer. Mistletoe nectar is valuable food for many native birds such as honeyeaters, and insects, possums and gliders. Mistletoe fruit is a vital part of the diet of the Mistletoebird and various honeyeaters. Its foliage is good cover for native birds for perching and nesting. Possums and many butterfly species feed on the foliage.

Effects of Mistletoe on Hosts

Mistletoe should only be considered problematic if in excessive numbers, such as over half the canopy of its host plant. Otherwise, consider it a valuable part of the local natural environment.

If in excessive numbers, mistletoe may harm hosts by using water freely (contributing to drought stress); by using host mineral nutrients, and by reducing the hosts foliage, hence slowing its growth rate.

Mistletoe Management

If present in excessive numbers, it indicates an imbalanced environment in need of remedial action. Short term actions such as removing mistletoe are not productive unless combined with long term measures to improve the local environment.

DUNG BEETLE ACTIVITY

You are probably seeing some dung beetle activity (even if you haven't released them on your property, they travel in search of dung).

If you see a shredded pat, it is the sign of a mass emergence of young beetles. In Bertram Lobart's words:

"When pads are shredded (ref: photo) it indicates there are lots of young beetles around (after a mass emergence) that are building up condition in prep for breeding. In this phase they don't bury dung, as they're not laying eggs yet, but rapidly shred the pad by taking thousands of tiny mouthfuls of dung, squeezing & swallowing the nutrientrich moisture and then discarding the fibrous remains, which is what you see. This can happen rapidly, in the space of a couple of hours, if there are lots of beetles around."

BROWN GOSHAWK

Accipiter fasciatus

Whilst spraying blackberry a few days ago in one of our gullies I was aware of the high pitched chatter of what sounded like a small bird.

In fact it was a Brown Goshawk flying back and forward at tree-top level, agitated by my presence. I spotted her stick nest in the topmost branches.

Our "What Bird is That" book by Neville Cayley lists the Brown Goshawk as:

"..dreaded by all the smaller birds, it procures its prey in sudden surprise attacks from cover. Food: mainly small birds. The call is a shrill chatter"

They are widely distributed throughout the mainland and Tasmania but this is the first example that we've noticed nesting on our place.


Do you have things that you don't use anymore, or maybe just need to clear some space?


