Mrs Pat Hayes from Tarcombe is ninety years old and the cairn on top of Mount Good Morning Bill was erected in the 1860's by the surveyor Thomas W. Pinniger.

Mrs Hayes hiked to the summit while on a Landcare wildflower walk this past spring, pausing only occasionally to explore the vegetation among the rocky granitic outcrops.

She was accompanied by her daughter Helen, son in law Adrian and a small group of Landcare members who share Helen & Adrian's interest in botany.

Confronting Mephistopheles by Dennis Spiteri

Confronting Mephistopheles is chiefly about the painful interior journey of Tony, emotionally solitary until his first relationship which ends with the sudden death of his beloved in an accident.

Tony struggles to rediscover a reason to live, eventually finding a measure of solace in painting, music and a new relationship.

Writing from his heart, Spiteri involved me in his struggle to come to terms with loss and grief.

The intensity of his love had left him dangerously bereft: as the title suggests he felt his bargain with the devil had been called to account, too soon. But should he have felt his love was so wonderful it could not also be 'ordinary'?

I could not help but think that his extraordinary passion in life had left him extraordinarily vulnerable to grief. Living with his vivid and consuming memories Tony manages to incorporate his grief into his work and eventually finds the resilience to establish a new and happy relationship.

In addition to the main theme, interesting side stories are Tony's immigrant family and education, his politics, Melbourne and Australia of the time, and also Germany where he spent some years.

His paintings today reflect the scale of his struggles and the grandeur of the universe.
