Peter & John have put a great deal of effort into blackberry and Paterson's curse control in recent years.

Take a drive down Ponkeen Creek Rd from Upton towards Tarcombe & you'll notice the changes in the landscape, especially along the creek lines.

All their larger blackberry infestations have gone.

In 2013 they have a follow-up programme patrolling every paddock and spraying all the small blackberry seedlings that have sprung up.

Peter reports that this work has taken one month so far this season and will take another month to complete.

To support Ponkeen, HCCC Landcare subsidised 50% of herbicide costs via funding from Goulburn Broken CMA.

LOCAL GOINGS ON

ACHERON BREAKAWAY BRIDGE REFURBISHMENT

Following the findings of a specialist bridge engineering consultant, Murrindindi Shire Council will be able to undertake refurbishment works on the bridge by reinforcing the structure with hidden steel beams.

Infrastructure spokesperson Cr Bernie Magner said the report provided significant analysis of the bridge structure and provided the framework for future works.

"The Breakaway Bridge project reference group recently met and formed a unanimous agreement on the refurbishment option. The group agreed to keep the bridge in its original form with the agreed option to reinforce the bridge with hidden steel beams and to design a new handrail in line with the original bridge handrail," Cr Magner said.

Reference Group spokesperson Samantha Gloury welcomed the minimal change option.

"The design is in line with the community's expectation to retain the feel of a traditional iconic type of timber trestle bridge," Ms Gloury said.

"Our community did not want a highly engineered bridge and the reference group has supported that wish throughout the consultation process."

Council, in conjunction with the reference group, is finalising the design and will prepare a tender for the works. Works are anticipated to be completed by mid 2013.
