DOGWOOD Cassinia Aculaeta



Dogwood is a very common understory and roadside shrub around the district. It flowers over summer with a mass of small creamy-white flowers in clusters a bit like a cauliflower-coloured broccoli. The buds have a pinkish tinge. The leaves are very thin, dark green on top but paler underneath and with the

edges rolled under. It is quick-growing and can be one of the first to regenerate in disturbed or burnt areas. It can cause a skin irritation in some people. By Louise Currie
