MANAGING FEED in DRY TIMES

Many of us have seen a disappointing spring, little useful summer rain and now a dry autumn. Even spring-calving properties are feeding out.

If there is no convincing autumn break, are you confident you can sustain your stock through the winter?

- * Do you have a feed budget?
- * What energy/protein does each class of stock need?
- * How much is contained within the grazing you do have?
- * If you need to supplement, how much and with what?
- * Are you familiar with costing fodders on energy value to ensure each class of stock is receiving the energy and protein they need?

And it's not just about the stock during challenging seasons; it's also about properly managing pastures under duress.

This type of information is useful for everyday use in farming, not just during difficult seasons.

Alison Desmond has kindly volunteered a Friday night to talk about all of this and more.

She comes with a wealth of experience in cattle and pasture management, having worked as a beef extension officer for the DPI since 2007.

As an accredited deliverer, she has co-ordinated and delivered innumerable beef programs such as **Beef-Cheque**, **ProGraze** and **EverGraze**, as well as being the EverGraze extension officer for the NE and co-ordinator of the Euroa Grazing Group
