Under his watch, the project has become one of the most active volunteer conservation projects in the nation, involving roughly 28,000 volunteers, planted more than 500,000 trees & shrubs, rehabilitate more than 1450 ha of farm land, brought 15 rare birds back from the brink of local extinction and installed 400 nestboxes.
