Letter to the Editor

The 20 November 2022 edition showed a photo of Avenel sand and landslips. See photo at left >>>

The recent consistent and heavy rainfalls in NE Victoria mean that water levels are higher in creeks and that peak flows can be extreme. The increased flows give the water more power to undercut creek banks and to move more and larger material downstream. One result is the collapse of trees along creek banks and next to the drains along roads; the latter explains several of the road blockages.

With gentle creek flow, water has the ability to pick up and move fine clay grains and these are carried down to Goolwa SA eventually, i.e. the ocean. The larger sand sized grains don't move at low water levels, but come flood times the sands and pebbles are picked up, moved downstream, and then deposited where the creek profiles flatten out on the northern plains, i.e. near the Hume Freeway which has been built near this slope change.

The exceptional rain this Spring has made some hillsides unstable and near Tallarook several landslips have occurred. There is plenty of evidence for landslips 100s and 1000s years ago on our steeper slopes, but we now have a few that are pristine and formed in October 2022.

One of these was over 1.5 km long, crossed the Goulburn Valley Highway and involved over 10,000 tonnes of debris. Within this debris, one single rock stands on its own today over 100m from its starting position and is over 10 tonnes.

Another landslip near Falls Creek is receiving publicity this year because it blocks an access road; and in recent years other landslips have blocked access to Tidal River at Wilsons Promontory and closed the Grampians for months.

I would be interested to hear of any 2022 landslips around the Strathbogie Ranges (Tallarook plateau to Mt Samaria) and maybe I could visit next year. Please record details now of dates and photos if possible.

I am always grateful for the support the local community gives to our ongoing Strathbogie Granite Research Project.


