
Welcome, Wumindjika & G'day

My overriding memory of this place is 6 of us taking one look at the denuded moonscape surrounding, and the 'concrete creek' sludging its way through, Queenstown and thinking there's got to be a better place than this to camp for the night - so we kept heading west, until we could go no further and ended up at Strahan.

A quick trivia question - Did you know that the next landfall at that latitude is the east coast of South America? But I digress.

Now this trip was before the Franklin River was blockaded in an effort to stop Tasmania's Premier, 'Electric Eric' (Reece) - he who thought that the pristine Tasmanian Wilderness would be better off flooded than preserved in its natural state for all time - from flooding yet another amazing environmental gem.

There's more to gain with enhanced farm dams

Last week I had the opportunity to attend a full-day training on farm dams, delivered by the ANU's Sustainable Farms team experts. The workshop was free to attend, thanks to a small training budget allocated by the Catchment Management Authorities (CMAs) for Landcare Facilitators and Volunteers as part of the Victorian Landcare Program.

Our Field Day on Farm dams at Janet and Justus' property on the 6th May had such a good response that we nearly had to turn people away; even with the few last-minute cancellations, we still had nearly 50 participants. However, the growing interest for doing things differently comes accompanied by doubts and fears, and rightly so, as water storage on farms is so crucial that we cannot muck it up.

But are we doing it in the most efficient way right now? And how do we measure efficiency?

The latest research shows that **enhanced dams**, compared to control dams, can offer multiple benefits, such as improved water quality (lower Nitrogen, Phosphorus, faecal bacteria and turbidity levels), reduced methane emissions (up to 57% less) and reduced evaporation rates (thanks to vegetation around the dam). Enhanced dams can bring about more eco-system services, like pollination, nutrient cycling, regulation of pest populations, soil carbon sequestration, control of soil erosion and retention of of sediments and nutrients, just to mention a few.

In turn, all this will contribute to more resilient farming systems and, on a larger scale, to more resilient and sustainable agricultural landscapes.

Carbon sequestration in farm dams is not a very well-known topic yet, but there's a chance that in the future you'll be able to earn carbon credits by managing your dam; even if this idea has been initially rejected, scientists are still lobbying for it, as explained in this article (ABC, 2022): Researchers push for carbon credit payments for Australian farmers who fence their dams.



Know Your Weeds

Horehound (Marrumbium Vulgare) - White Regionally Controlled Weed

Horehound is an erect bushy shrub, a perennial plant, that grows to 75cm tall. It is a widespread weed of bushland, roadsides and cropping fringes and unlikely to be confused with any native species.



The leaves are blue/green with a silvery appearance due to fine hairs on top, but they are wooly underneath. Their edges are lightly serrated and can be crinkled, leathery, rounded and up to 7cm in diameter.

It flowers from summer through to autumn with white flowers, formed in dense rounded clusters about 6-10mm long. These flowers surround the stem at the nodes, with the stems woody at the base and branched at the top.

The best time to eradicate this weed is April to September by either spot spring or cultivation before flowering.
