#### **BE AWARE - DETOUR IN PLACE!**

Well, after waiting months for Mitchell Shire Council to repair the washway, on the Seymour-Highlands Rd just near the corner with Dropmore Rd (a result of the excessive rain and flooding last October) it appears that the repairs to the road were not very durable as last Friday evening part of the newly repaired road collapsed again.

However, this time the condition of the road has deteriorated even further and a detour via Dropmore Rd, Caveat-Dropmore Rd and Gum Rd has been put into place - commencing at the Highlands Hall to the south and Dropmore Rd to the north. A most inconvenient and, along Gum Rd in the wet, dangerous route.

As this road is a school bus route, it is to be hoped that urgent repair works can be undertaken immediately and completed in a more timely manner than the previous traffic light situation. In the meantime, factor in at least an extra 30mins travel time via the detour, opt for the Goulburn Valley Hwy to Seymour as an alternative, pack a cut lunch and hot drink to keep you sustained and contact Mitchell Shire Council - 5734 6200

#### **Know Your Weeds**

#### Horsetail (Equisetum spp.) State Prohibited Weed

Horsetails are among the world's worst agricultural weeds because of their invasive capabilities. They are native to all continents except Australia and New Zealand.


Horsetail is an erect, non-flowering herb with ribbed/grooved stems to 80cm long, with green leaves that come in 2 shapes - ring and sheath. There are 2 types of stems - fertile & sterile - and both are jointed like sheoak segments.

Pale green to yellow spores are produced at the end of the fertile stems in cones 1-4cm long.

The rhizomous roots are deep growing, up to several metres long and the plant has the ability to spread by theses roots, tubers and spores as well as through the careless disposal of garden waste.

As a State Prohibited Weed the control of this weed is the responsibility of **DEECA** - **deeca.vic.gov.au**

#### **BE READY FOR THE CONVERSATION**

Australia is having a conversation about the referendum being held later this year.

Council has a responsibility to provide factual and practical information to our community about changes to law and legislation that impacts our democracy, to enable informed participation in the voting process.

The Voice referendum is about whether we should change the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia by establishing a body called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. The Voice would be an independent and permanent advisory body.

We are committed to sharing clear, unambiguous information with the community, enabling residents to make a considered and informed choice in the upcoming referendum.

Voting in the referendum is compulsory for all eligible Australian citizens aged 18 years and over. Be informed at voice.gov.au.
