The textile industry is a major emitter on the global scale for a couple of reasons. Firstly, growing cotton and other natural fibres uses a huge amount of water and fertiliser.

But the biggest factor is that most of our clothes, over 60 per cent, are made from synthetic fibres (think polyester and nylon) which are made from fossil fuels. Adding to our troubles, each of us buys on average 56 new pieces of clothing each year.

## **Know Your Weeds**

#### Cape Tulip (Moraea flaccida & Moraea miniata)

#### **Regionally Prohibited Weed**

Cape Tulip is **TOXIC** to stock and comes in two varieties - one leaf and two leaf.

Although very similar in all respects the two leaf variety does not produce viable seed but instead develops a cluster of many small cormils (a small corm or bud at the leaf axis or the base of the plant). Its flowers are also smaller & the plant produces 2-3 leaves rather than one.

The Cape Tulip reproduces from seed or corms and has a stiff stem that is 30-60cm tall. The eaves are flat and ribbed, only 1-2cm wide but up to 1m long.

Its flowers are usually orange or pink, with a yellow throat, 6 petals, 3-5 cm in diameter and appear in clusters at the end of the branches in September - October.

The fruit is green, turning brown when mature.

A perennial weed it needs to be controlled by spot spraying with a suitable herbicide and the best time to do this is May to November.

As it can be spread in a multitude of ways - movement of soil, eaten by stock, by slashing or mowing, in farm produce and carried on machinery or vehicles - it needs to be dealt with promptly when first noticed.
