Since the floods in October 2022 so many of our local roads, be they highways (under the auspices of Vicroads or RRV) or byways (Shire maintained roads) both dirt and bitumen, have been in incredibly poor shape and in desperate need of repairs, due to those flooding rains.

No doubt most, if not all readers, know of stretches of local roads that need attention 13 months on from the original damage being done.

It appears that one regular traveler along the Yea-Highlands Rd has decided that a bit of graffiti, at the two most damaged locations, might expedite the repair process. Unfortunately, I can't show you what that graffiti looks like - in this G rated publication - due to the use of expletives. However, suffice to say that although an F word has been used it wasn't Frustration - although it is obvious that is what the author is feeling....along with the rest of us who travel this route almost daily.



Possibly the delay in repairing these particular roads may be due to the fact that the parts of Murrindindi, Mitchell and Strathbogie Shires, that fall within the HCCC area, are at the very extremities of these local government areas and council staff and councilors don't get to visit the boundaries very often and are therefore unaware of any problems.

With Summer approaching it's time to think about fire safety

With El Nino now official across Australia and the influence of a positive Indian dipole climate driver underway - Queensland, the Northern Territory and Western Australia have already experienced severe bushfires, property loss and fatalities. And Summer here is still 25 days away!

A high-risk fire season has been predicted to commence shortly for south and eastern Australia.

For some readers who are still pondering what needs to be done in advance of the fire season, during the fire season and on the day of any bushfire in our local area, the following facts and reflections (Credit: ABC news article by Catherine Hanrahan 27-12-18) might assist.

"What can we learn about saving lives from studying more than a century of bushfires?

A lot — but experts warn too many Australians still do not properly understand the risks and new research suggests nine in 10 Victorians in high-risk areas (the HCCC) would not follow the prevailing advice to leave early on days of high fire danger.

Most lives have been lost on a few horror days — and in one state - our state, Victoria.

Between 1901 and 2011, 825 people lost their lives in more than 260 bushfires. Of those killed, 92 were firefighters. More than 80% of the deaths were in January and February, and 61% happened in Victoria. (A total of 506 with the next

closest state being NSW with 139 deaths)

Even more strikingly, 65 per cent of all the people killed in bushfires across that 110-year period died on just nine days, including Black Saturday in 2009 when 173 people died in Australia's worst natural disaster.

The Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission looked at the circumstances of how 173 people died on Black Saturday. Its analysis found that while most people were aware they were at risk, 24 per cent did not even have a basic awareness they were in danger of bushfires."

Having a plan and implementing it is the most important thing you can do. Fire plans can include pre-season preparation, season preparation, actions on high fire danger days, when to leave, etc.

Know Your Weeds

South African Orchid (Disa Bracteata)

Watch out for this highly invasive weed orchid!

On TGN reader found 16 plants in one paddock alone.

Now is the time to hunt the fleshy basal leaf form and flower heads before they dry off.

Avoid picking the flowerheads when dry as this can disperse the seed. Follow the instructions in these two links- bag and dispose of in your hard rubbish and NOT in your compost or green waste.

This weed is spreading throughout our hills. It can be spread via wind, cars, feet, stock.

Please put any records you find on **iNaturalist** so we can map where it's spreading through the area.
