Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

Further recollections on the start of Hughes Creek Catchment Collaborative.

The driving force behind its setting up was the late Tony Nicholas who lived at Mount Tickatory. He realised that Government was moving towards a preference for dealing with, and providing grants, for efficiency reasons to larger Landcare groups.

Initially, a grant was awarded to prepare a catchment wide strategy which was undertaken by an agricultural and environmental consultant.

The Strategy was based on extensive consultation with the community and focused on:


- Rabbit eradication and reduction in harbour (bracken fern although it was also found to be bandicoot habitat)
- weeds
- revegetation
- water quality
- wildlife habitat

To familiarise members with the catchment, members of the newly formed HCCC, walked the full length of the Hughes Creek from where it rises near Terip to its confluence with the Goulburn near Nagambie.

We walked much of it with our three young daughters. The group was amazed by the fern filled gorges, rocky outcrops and granitic sand beaches along the length of the creek.


