### 2 Items that may be of interest to TGN readers...Read on.

### #1 - Register to Vote for Local Council Elections

Eligible residents and ratepayers are urged to check they are enrolled to vote for the upcoming local council elections by **4 pm Wednesday 7 August**.

Electoral Commissioner, Sven Bluemmel, has issued a call ahead of the enrolment deadline: 'If you're 18 or over and you live in or pay rates to a Victorian council, enrol and have your say on the future of your local council.'

Australian citizens who have recently turned 18 or changed address can enrol or update their details online at vec.vic.gov.au/enrolment

Anyone on the state electoral roll is automatically enrolled for their current address for these elections. There are also additional council enrolment categories for non-resident owners, occupiers, company nominees and non-Australian citizens who pay rates.

#### **BUT since the last Council Elections**

The rules for council enrolment have changed. Property owners who don't live in the council area but may be eligible to vote because they pay rates should contact their local council for further information.

The 2024 Victorian local council elections will be the state's largest single election program, with a predicted 4.7 million voters participating in 465 individual elections across 78 councils.

Moira Shire Council is under administration and will not have a general election this October.

Further information on enrolment is available by calling 131 832 or at vec.vic.gov.au, where voters can also sign up to the free VoterAlert service to receive important election reminders by SMS and email.

### #2 - Register your Feedback for VicGrid's Draft Transmisson Plan

VicGrid has launched the Victorian Government's draft Victorian Transmission Plan Guidelines, a document that explains how we will prepare the Victorian Transmission Plan – a new long-term strategic plan for renewable energy and transmission development in our State.

The draft Victorian Transmission Plan Guidelines outline how we will determine how much renewable energy generation is needed and when, as well as how we will determine what transmission projects are needed to support that new generation.

It also includes a study area (a map) showing what parts of Victoria we may investigate further for suitability to host future renewable energy zones.

Everyone is invited to visit the VicGrid site and read about the Victorian Transmission Plan and provide feedback or a submission.

There is a lot of information to go through, but this is a vitally important process to ensure the future of renewable energy and transmission in Victoria and everyone's contribution is invaluable.

Without input from local communities VicGrid can only assume that all those who reside in a particular location are amenable to whatever developments may be proposed in the future.

NB: For those readers who have concerns about, or are in favour of, FERA's proposed windfarm this would be a relevant forum to contribute to.




