At a recent meeting in Alexandra FERA presented their latest wind turbine layout plan including underground conduit links between towers.

Some links follow road reservations such as Dropmore Road and Highlands Road with resulting impact on roadside vegetation while others run through adjoining properties.

The alignment of the overhead transmission line link to Molesworth and then through to the main interstate transmission lines between Alexandra and Glenburn remains a mystery.


The FERA Alexandra presentation can be found on the SRRCG website or the FERA website.

Readers should also be aware that VicGrid are consulting with the Victorian Community as part of the review of Renewable Energy Zones (REZ) and the developers FERA are keen for the Strathbogie Ranges to be included within a REZ. At present the Strathbogie Ranges are not in a REZ.

The Victorian State Government, through VicGrid, has opened a consultation process on the Victorian Transmission Plan which includes the areas that they will investigate to be the new Renewable Energy Zones.

Our region is shown as a high priority for further investigation to become a REZ. See the map at the link here.

If our region is included as a REZ in the 2025 Victorian Transmission Plan and if the Fera project goes ahead with new Transmission lines installed, it could quite possibly be the first of many renewable projects across our unique region.

So, please, if you value the amenity of this region, take some affirmative action.

Submissions close at 11:59 pm on Sunday 25 August 2024

Note that there is a third submission, due September 30th, which is an opportunity for us to provide detailed feedback and evidence about why we believe this region is not suitable to become a REZ.

SRRCG is currently working on this submission which will provide evidence on the region's biodiversity, significant landscape, proportion of "lifestyle" property owners and land use and socioeconomic factors.

We will also question the assumption that the region has a high wind resource. We will make this submission available once completed to assist our community with their own submissions.

Strathbogies Responsible Renewables Community Group



Majority of attendees walk out of wind farm meeting

"An information session about the FERA Seymour Wind Farm was held at the Alexandra Secondary College on the morning of Saturday 27th July.

Project lead Andrew Lawson presented a Powerpoint presentation outlining the current state of the project and was seeking to answer "every question" before the session ended.

He spoke about the processes being undertaken and the reports being compiled, as well as the planned timeline for the project. They are aiming 80-100 wind turbines, and when the project ends, the base will be removed to a depth of half a metre. The turbines are expected to have hub heights of between 120 and 160 metres and rotor diameters of 160 to 170 metres.

There were also discussions around fire safety, noise impacts and bird impacts. The audience were keen to engage in a Q&A session following the presentation.

One audience member asked why no towns were marked on the map of turbine locations, and Mr Lawson responded that they would be included on the website, when added.

There were also concerns from landholders within the planned turbine or transmission line paths that they had had no contact from FERA. The person was told that they were trying to get in contact with everyone, and that they can make contact directly.

When asked about the financials around the project, Mr Lawson said the cost is expected to be \$1.2 to 1.5 billion, paid for eventually through energy sales of \$180 to 200 million per year. It will take 10 to 12 years to pay off.

Another question was about the Transmission Plan review currently being undertaken via the Engage Victoria website. Mr Lawson said he believed it likely that the area of their planned wind farm would be included due to its proximity to pre-existing transmission lines. He added later that the project is not required to be in a Renewable Energy Zone (REZ).

There were also questions around the recycling of the towers and bases, with an audience member concerned that the depth of removal of the base would not be far enough to enable ploughing and the re-use of land afterwards, as well as the chemicals in the concrete.

He was also asked why the transmission lines are not being put underground, and he responded that there would be loss in the lines and that it wouldn't be economically viable.

Asked whether the opposition in the meeting would be included in the reporting about the project, Mr Lawson said that it wouldn't as it was an information session. Around 95% of the people in the room lifted their hands when asked whether they opposed the project.

Other concerns included land sale prices, the lack of wind in the area, whether there would be compulsory acquisitions, bushfire plans, compensation levels for small landholders, substation locations, why the survey was conducted at the Seymour Alternative Farming Expowhere most people wouldn't be impacted by the wind farm, how people suffering negative visual impacts would be compensated, and whether easements would be leased by FERA.

By the end of the meeting, most attendees had walked out."

Any suggestions will then be reviewed by the respective LEAP Steering Groups (Nagambie or Strathbogie Tablelands) before the plan is finalised for publication.

Draft documents for both areas were developed following community meetings in April (Strathbogie Tablelands) and June (Nagambie) and both steering groups are encouraging locals to provide comments online to assist in the finalisation of these documents.

Major Road Patching Underway in Strathbogie Shire

Strathbogie Shire is also set to undertake major road patching on several local roads throughout August and September in preparation for resealing next year.

The patching works will take place on Creightons Creek Road, Euroa-Strathbogie Road, Spring Creek Road, and Merton-Strathbogie Road.

The works, which total nearly \$718,000 (including GST), are part of Council's 2023-24 Capital Works budget.

The works are expected to be completed by the end of September, weather permitting, with resealing scheduled for early next year.






