### SEPTEMBER 7th - NATIONAL THREATENED SPECIES DAY

Over the last couple of years any articles about this date have featured a photo of the last surviving thylacine (Tasmanian Tiger) - Benjamin - at the Hobart Zoo. This is fitting as September 7th was the day he died in 1937.

However, although Benjamin is unfortunately the poster boy for this date, the subsequent extinction of his species is really just the tip of the iceberg for Australia's fauna and flora.

As a country Australia has the worst extinction rate of its wildlife in the world! That's a pretty depressing statistic to be rated #1 for.

With another 18 species being added to Threatened Species list since July this year, these additions mean that now 2,224 Australian species are being recognised as under threat of extinction.

Whilst some of the more recent inclusions aren't furry and cute - including the pig-nosed turtle (listed as vulnerable), Pugh's sphagnum frog (endangered), three critically endangered freshwater fish and three lizards, including one that had only been classified a species since 2022 - they are still entitled to live long and happy lives.

According to the ACF (Australian Conservation Foundation) each species is facing threat from habitat destruction or degradation, as well as climate change.


As a nation we can do so much better than this. Our plants and animals are among the most unique in the world. Let's see what we all can do to preserve the vital habitats of our local area.

#### **Springtime in the Natural Treasures**

Despite a pretty rough recent history, bushlands across Mitchell Shire have recovered remarkably well and are now rich places for native plants and animals. Seymour Bushland Park is one of the 36 places recognised as Natural Treasures in Mitchell Shire.

Seymour Bushland Park's Committee of Management with BEAM Mitchell Environment Group and the support of staff from Mitchell Shire Council are organising a day for everyone to come along for walks and family events at Seymour Bushland Park on Sunday 13th October.

This will be the peak of the wildflower season so there will be lots to see and do, including many activities for children. Morning tea and a light lunch will be provided but bookings are needed for catering.

The SRRCG committee will be holding a community meeting on Sunday 15th September, 4:00pm at the Country Club Hotel in Yea.





#### **OUR KERBSIDE SERVICES ARE CHANGING**

Changes to kerbside bin collection services are on the way for Murrindindi Shire, with a new Policy outlining details of the four-bin service, including collection frequencies, mandatory and optional services and how waste and recycling charges will be applied.

These changes are required under new rules by the Victorian Government and aim to enhance waste management practices, reduce landfill waste, and minimise greenhouse gas emissions.

Murrindindi Shire Council will join all other Victorian councils in introducing a four-bin kerbside collection service, to commence in July 2025, as per the new Kerbside Collection Services Policy adopted at the 28 August Council Meeting.
