Bring your fishing gear and try your luck in the lake, conveniently stocked with fish!



And did the Earth move for you too dear?

It appears that last Sunday night The Granite News wasn't the only thing landing with a thud in the HCCC area. There was an impressive earthquake happening in our region too. I certainly felt it at my place and after realising that it wasn't a low flying aircraft about to crash, assumed correctly that it must be terrestrial rather than aerial. Of course Neil can explain it so much better. Ed.

Large cracks in rocks are a common place for earthquakes to occur. With changing stresses in the Earth, movement can occur as it did last night, and as occurred 2-3 years ago in NE Victoria.

Large cracks can be traced 10s or 100s km and are faults, and one side of the fault moves relative to the other side.

The reported position last night is well inside the Strathbogie granite, and there are numerous relatively small cracks in the granite where the two sides of the crack simply open slightly. These are called joints. Many of the creeks on the SB plateau are guided by these joints (including Seven Creeks) and this is easily seen if one looks at the creek patterns on a map.

As last Sunday night's data is analysed further by Geoscience Australia we will have a clearer picture of the exact magnitude, depth and location. Aftershocks are always a possibility after any earthquake.

It is still pretty impressive that we can be delivered all this data on the earthquake in 1-2 hours just after midnight.

The walk is a surprisingly gentle ascent to the top of the famous Golden Mountain, which boasts one of the best views in Strathbogie.






