#### Welcome, Wumindjika & G'day

Next week - 21st - 27th October is National Water Week. Each year this week takes the opportunity to raise awareness about the finite nature and importance of water. This is a universal situation and one that we need to be more aware of.

Way back in 2002 the United Nations Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights stated that:

"The human right to water entitles everyone to sufficient, safe, acceptable, physically accessible and affordable water for personal and domestic uses."

Universal access to sanitation is, "not only fundamental for human dignity and privacy, but is one of the principal mechanisms for protecting the quality" of water resources. Furthermore, in April 2011, the Human Rights Council stated that access to safe drinking water and sanitation is a human right: a right to life and to human dignity.

Whilst the above adopted observations offer noble sentiments the reality is yet to be achieved.

To put this into perspective a few stats from the UN

- 884 million people in the world do not have access to safe drinking-water.
- 2.6 billion people lack access to basic sanitation, that's 40% of the world's population.
- According to the World Health Organization (WHO), between 50 and 100 litres of water per person per day are needed to ensure that the most basic needs are met
- Most of the people categorized as lacking access to clean water use about 5 litres a day - one tenth of the average daily amount used in rich countries to flush toilets.
- Together, unclean water and poor sanitation are the world's second biggest killer of children, and it has been calculated that 443 million school days are lost each year to water-related illness!!

So, the next time you leave the tap running whilst brushing your teeth and safe, potable water is wasted just going down the drain, maybe think again - and use water more wisely.

Join a guided walk, including the nursery area, and get propagation tips from arboretum staff and volunteers.



The song roughly translated – Wishing the audience love and respect, Travel with love and respect, Community with love and respect, Country with love and respect, strength, beauty love and respect may these things travel with you always. #### The Greater Glider - voted the 2024 Marsupial of the Year

The greater glider is Australia's largest gliding mammal.

With excellent night vision, they swoop from branch to branch, sometimes as far as 100 metres at a time, searching for juicy leaves upon which to eat. They steer using their tails, which are longer than their body, and their babies love to hitch a ride on mum's back.

They can range in colour from dark chocolate brown to almost entirely white and communicate through scent-marking.

Greater gliders were once common throughout the forests of Queensland, NSW and Victoria, but populations have crashed by more than 50% in the last 20 years due to habitat destruction and bushfires. They were listed as an endangered species in 2022.

The Victorian Local Government Elections are now in full swing and the VEC (Victorian Electoral Commission) wants TGN readers to be aware of the following -

- · Ballot packs were mailed out last week
- If you haven't received one by Tuesday 15th October go to vec.vic.gov.au to complete an online ballot pack replacement form
- Ballot papers need to be completed and returned to the designated Local Government Electoral Office (see ballot pack for each LG area's details) by 6pm on Friday 25th October
- This can be done in person or by mailing the completed forms to the above location(s).

Whilst local governments are seen as the lowest tier of governance in Australia - after Federal and State levels and therefore of no great importance, some people might not be bothered with all of the above....

A couple of things to note

- We live in a democracy, so make the most of your vote (at any level of government) as it is valuable and people are literally dying around the world to achieve this important human right.
- Local governments are so much more than just rates, roads and rubbish and as councillors live in our local communities they also have a vested interest in ensuring that those towns/locales are vibrant and pleasant places to live.


