Thank You from the Terip Community

From a ferocious electrical storm that started several fires last Friday to a very damp and chilly conditions this weekend, we have seen some amazing weather in Terip within a week. Thank you to all of the CFA volunteers that attended to several fires in and around Terip last Friday and in the following days putting out flare ups. Thankfully there was very little wind and helicopters were available or we could have seen a very different outcome.

Some more information about the Sugar Glider

The Sugar Glider is found in northern and eastern Australia, including northern Western Australia, Northern Territory, Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and south-eastern South Australia. The Sugar Glider's viability is threatened by the clearing of its native woodland habitat, by urban and agricultural development, altered fire regimes and predation by introduced predators including cats and foxes.

The Sugar Glider has a membrane extending from its fifth finger to its ankle enabling it to glide up to 50 m between trees. In flight, the Sugar Glider uses its long bushy tail for stability and steering and is most active at night. It sleeps by day in nests made of leaves in tree hollows. Groups of up to seven adults and their young may form a 'clan' and share a nest. Among their own clan they are playful and social but will defend their territory aggressively and noisily if threatened by other animals or approached by Sugar Gliders from a different clan. Dominant males mark other clan

members and the territory around the nest with secretions from scent glands on their chest. Breeding starts in June or July, and females usually give birth to twins, which remain in the pouch for just over two months, they then leave the nest to forage for food, usually with their mother. They become independent of the group when they are seven to ten months old.

Water Wise Ways

Even though Yarck scored 42mm of rain the other week rainfall on the Tablelands has been pretty underwhelming this year. Despite Australia's average rainfall being well below the global average, we are the world's greatest per capita consumers of water. Here are a few water saving tips for future reference

1. Leaks - dripping taps and leaking toilets can waste more than you think. For toilets a slight leak = 4,000 litres a year, a more significant one 96,000 litres! For taps that drip once per second it's 7,000 litres a year.

2. A shower is the biggest water guzzler in the house accounting for an average 34% of indoor water use. Fitting a waterwise shower head can reduce this by 50%. Turn the tap off when cleaning teeth is a must!

Did you know??

Eight million, that's **8,000,000** tonnes of plastic ends up in our oceans every year. It's no wonder that more than half of all whales and dolphins have ingested plastic. Tragically many of them die a slow death. And that's not the only threat. Marine animals can become entangled in plastic bags or discarded nets and eventually drown or end up with painful open wounds. Here are a few ideas to stop plastic from invading our marine environments...

- * Replace you plastic toothbrush with a bamboo one (a plastic one = 500 years to decompose)
- * Swap your take-away cup for a reusable one (a take-away cup = 30 years to decompose)
- * Say no to plastic straws, try a reusable one instead (a straw used for 20 mins = 200 years to decompose)
- * Swap a plastic ice-cream cup for a cone (a plastic ice-cream cup = 450 years to decompose)
- * Take reusable shopping bags and leave the unnecessary vege plastic wrappings behind (a plastic bag = 20 years to decompose)
- * Replace plastic bottles with a reusable bottle (approx. 75% of plastic bottles are not recycled and end up in landfill = 450 years to decompose)





If you're caught in a grassfire on a farm, move to somewhere with minimal vegetation, such as a ploughed or well-grazed paddock and monitor conditions.
