A few points, from a recent HCCC meeting, that may be of interest to all. Rabbits are still the number one pest in Australia, although hares are increasing in numbers. And then there's deer!!

Soil carbon is reduced by many factors; burning, deep ripping, droughts, etc. Good farming practice is the best way to increase carbon in the soil - deep rooted and perennial pastures.

Platypus are still present along Whiteheads Creek at the Oak St bridge in Seymour. The WHC Flood Plain Management Group has now been formed with reps from Mitchell Shire, GBCMA, and community members. There will be a Platypus Monitoring Workshop. Peter Mitchell is monitoring creek



Riparian Walk along County Creek

Another month, another beautiful walk, with this being the 4th in this series of SRCMN Riparian walks. Ruffy is proving to be a bounty of new and exciting waterways to discover, and we'll explore the beautiful County Creek this time. This walk is long (7km) and of moderate difficulty with some steep scrambles over loose, gravelly terrain. Hiking experience isn't necessary, but an average level of fitness and mobility will be required. Difficulty will increase drastically if wet weather precedes it, or if it's hot. We'll meet at the **Ruffy CFA shed** before driving out to the starting point at the bridge on Longwood-Ruffy Rd. From there, we'll descend down the County Creek and its gorges, before taking a shortcut through paddocks back to the starting point (YAY! no car shuffle).

Please note, as we'll be traversing private property, no dogs or other pets will be allowed.
