# Did you know??

The **Hughes Creek Catchment Collaborative**, the publisher of The Granite News, is a Landcare Network combining Highlands, Whitehead's Creek, Upper Hughes Creek & Hughes Creek Landcare Groups. It is based in the southern Strathbogie Ranges, Central Victoria Upland Slopes and covers the localities of Ruffy, Terip, Caveat, Highlands, Dropmore, Tarcombe, Kobyboyn and Whitehead's Creek. Formed in 1994, the Hughes Creek Catchment Collaborative (HCCC) has evolved from various Rabbit Action Groups and Landcare Groups that started in the 1980s.

Landcare enables people to do something practical about protecting and restoring Australia's unique environment. Landcare members have control in setting the activities and the focus that HCCC wishes to pursue however these activities must be in line with the Landcare ethic -


"A caring attitude and a wish to pass our planet onto the next generation in a healthier state than we find it in today."

# **Geology of the Strathbogie District**

For many people reading The Granite News the rocks beneath your house will be granite; and this is not an ordinary granite but one that is known internationally among geoscientists.

The Strathbogie plateau is dominated by granite—a hard rock that resists erosion by rivers and forms some iconic landforms. There are boulders of 10m height, slabs extending 100s metres, and cliff lines that have been used by rock climbers in the past.

Come to hear a community talk on the age of our granite, why it is famous worldwide for an unusual mineral, how the slightly different types of granite dictate the rugged forest areas and gentler farmland, affect groundwater, contribute to nutrients, and become involved in runaway erosion events.

Neil Phillips has been studying the whole Strathbogie granite from Tallarook to Mt Samaria for many years and his current focus is on the surrounds of the town of Strathbogie. He convened the highly successful community session within the International Granite Symposium held in Benalla in 2017.

**Friday 31**<sup>st</sup> **May 2019, 7pm Strathbogie Hall**. This will be a talk illustrated by many local photos, rock samples to play with, and maps.



# YES! Democracy is happening again!!

The polling place for the federal election on **Saturday** May 18th will be at the Tablelands Community Centre, opposite the Ruffy Produce Store, between 8am and 6pm.
