Switch off and unplug appliances = save \$\$\$

A quick and easy way to reduce your electricity bill is to turn off appliances at the powerpoint when you're not using them. When things like computers and TVs switch into standby mode, they still use electricity, which can really add up over time. Get into the habit of turning off and unplugging your kettle, washing machine, stereo and other items when you're not using them.

Other ways to switch off and save are:

- **Unplug your second fridge** If you have a second fridge, keep it unplugged & switched off until you need it.
- **Dress for the temperature** Put on a jumper and warm socks instead of turning on the heater.
- Avoid using the dryer Hang your washing outside on sunny days, and use an indoor clothes rack when it's raining, instead of using the clothes dryer.
- * Hot water bottle Use a hot water bottle instead of an electric blanket. If you do use an electric blanket, turn it on to warm up the bed before you get in, then turn if off.

Canyon celebrate Woodstock 50th anniversary

In August 1969, the Woodstock Music Festival hosted the newly formed Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young debut concert. Fifty years later, four piece Melbourne band Canyon continue to share the love by bringing their Woodstock 50th Anniversary tour to Ruffy in August as part of the 2019 regional Café Culture Series. Canyon's line-up is singer, songwriter and guitarist Peter Chapman, singer, co-song writer & percussionist Louise Dempsey, Bruce Packard on vocals, bass and mandolin and Josh Bennett on vocals and multiple guitars.

Canyon's current tour features tastefully arranged and impressive acoustic versions of many of Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young's greatest songs, including some of those first heard by the world 50 years ago at Woodstock that also inspired and became a major influence on the distinctive sound of Canyon's original compositions about deserts, forests, raging water, open highways and broken hearts. Their concert also features many other great songs from the 'Laurel Canyon/ Westcoast' tradition of the 60s and 70s such as America, Jackson Browne, Linda Ronstadt, The Band, Little Feat, Seals & Crofts, Emmy Lou Harris and Joni Mitchell.


