Hughes Creek Aquatic Project—Update

In February this year, 26 sites between Avenel and Tarcombe were surveyed for **Macquarie Perch** (Macquaria australasica), predominantly via backpack electrofishing. This included 19 control sites and seven habitat restoration sites. A total of 626 fish were captured, measured and weighed, of which native fish accounted for 51% of the catch. The most abundant native species caught was River Blackfish, while the most abundant introduced species was **Common Carp**. There was a significant decrease in **Redfin** abundance with only 43 individuals collected compared to 366 in 2018, which can be attributed to successful targeted exotic species reduction in both autumn and spring last year and the unfavourable drought conditions. Only 46 **Macquarie Perch** were captured, which is comparable to surveys conducted in 2012 following drought and flood, and consistent with other **Macquarie Perch** populations in the GB catchment. Despite the low flows/drought conditions at time of surveying, the Macquarie Perch captured were

generally in good condition and were not displaying signs of stress. Macquarie
Perch & River Blackfish were confirmed to be using habitat structures within six of the eight



works sites, including three of the four new habitat sites completed just last year with Recreational Fishing Licence (RFL) funding. **by Christine Glassford**


