Kangaroo Harvesting Program

The Kangaroo Harvesting Program (KHP) began in Victoria on 1 October 2019 to enable commercial harvesting of kangaroos in Victoria.

The Victorian Government's permanent Kangaroo Harvesting Program aims to assist in managing kangaroo populations around the state and support Victoria's kangaroo pet food industry.

Accredited shooters will now be able to harvest kangaroos and have carcasses processed for pet food by licensed businesses – making it easier for farmers, minimising waste and supporting jobs in regional communities.

The new program is administered by the Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions, and includes strict safeguards to ensure harvesting is carried out at a sustainable level, that animal welfare standards are met, and that the livelihoods of local farmers are protected.

The Kangaroo Harvesting Program replaces the Kangaroo Pet Food Trial, which has run for the past five years & informed the design of the permanent program.

The program will ensure Victoria's kangaroo population is managed in a sustainable way, in line with animal welfare standards, while helping landowners who are having problems with kangaroos. These problems might include crop destruction, loss of water meant for livestock and damage to property such as fences.

The Kangaroo Harvesting Program operates in accordance with the Kangaroo Harvest Management Plan:

Kangaroo harvest numbers will be dictated by a quota which will be updated every 12 months in response to kangaroo population surveys and population modelling.

From this quota, harvesters in different parts of Victoria can apply for a kangaroo allocation which dictates how many kangaroos they can harvest in any given region. The quota for the central region is 2,810.

Strathbogie Ranges Riparian Walk #2

Our riparian walks are back and bigger than ever, with 6 walks covering the best of the bogies as well as some new gems. The aim of these walks is to become better acquainted with our local waterways, and record some of their standout features along the way.

The first walk in our new riparian walk series was the beautiful mineral springs in Ruffy, so now it's bogie's turn to wow walkers with it's stunning scenery.

This walk is long (5km/3.5hours) and of moderate difficulty with several creek crossings and a lot of rock hopping. Hiking experience isn't necessary, but an average level of fitness and mobility will be required. The walk difficulty will increase drastically if wet weather precedes it, or if it's hot on the day.

Walkers will meet on the clearing on Fergusons Lane. From there, walkers will descend down Wombat Creek, following it to Forlonge Memorial Road. Walkers will then be driven back to their cars at the starting point.

Please note, as we'll be traversing private property on these walks, no dogs or other pets are allowed.

HCCC News Update

Some recent HCCC news that may be of interest to readers -

- Whiteheads Creek Landcare have planted more trees along Lambing Gully Rd
- Cool burning trials at Gobur have commenced in consultation with Taungurung and the CFA
- Deer continue to be a pest problem and in the last month in Highlands a total of 174 deer were shot on 2 properties. It is estimated there are 1 million deer in Victoria and that 400,000 a year need to be killed to limit their numbers
- A bus tour by tree scientists has recorded die back or Canopy Collapse on mainly west-facing slopes in the local area. Further research, mapping & study are planned for Red Stringybark, Mountain Red Gum & Long-leafed Box.

The Climate Crisis

This is the speech Greta Thunberg delivered to the UN Climate Action summit on Monday 23rd September 2019

This is all wrong. I shouldn't be standing here. I should be back at school on the other side of the ocean. Yet you all come to me for hope? How dare you! You have stolen my dreams and my childhood with your empty words. And yet I am one of the lucky ones. People are suffering. People are dying. Entire ecosystems are collapsing. We are in the beginning of a mass extinction. And all you talk about is money and fairy tales of eternal economic growth. How dare you!

For more than thirty years the science has been crystal clear. How dare you continue to look away, and come here saying you are doing enough, when the politics and solutions needed are nowhere in sight. With today's emissions levels our remaining CO₂ budget will be gone in less than eight and a half years. You say you 'hear' us and that you understand the urgency. But no matter how sad and angry I am, I don't want to believe that. Because if you fully understand the situation and still kept on failing to act, then you would be evil. And I refuse to believe that.

The popular idea of cutting our emissions in half in ten years only gives us a 50% chance of staying below 1.5C degrees, and the risk of setting off irreversible chain reactions beyond human control.

Maybe 50% is acceptable to you. But those numbers don't include tipping points, most feedback loops, additional warming hidden by toxic air pollution or the aspects of justice and equity. They also rely on my and my children's generation sucking hundreds of billions of tonnes of your CO2 out of the air with technologies that barely exist. So a 50% risk is simply not acceptable to us – we who have to live with the consequences.

To have a 67% chance of staying below a 1.5C global temperature rise – the best odds given by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change – the world had 420 gigatonnes of carbon dioxide left to emit back on 1 January 2018. Today that figure is already down to less than 350 gigatonnes. How dare you pretend that this can be solved with business-as-usual and some technical solutions. With today's emissions levels, that remaining CO2 budget will be entirely gone in less than eight-and-a-half years.

There will not be any solutions or plans presented in line with these figures today. Because these numbers are too uncomfortable. And you are still not mature enough to tell us like it is. You are failing us. But the young people are starting to understand your betrayal. The eyes of all future generations are upon us. And if you choose to fail us I say we will never forgive you.

We will not let you get away with this. Right here, right now is where we draw the line. The world is waking up. And change is coming whether you like it or not.




