Strathbogie Shire Council has released its draft Arts and Culture Strategy which aims to increase opportunities for creative stimulation and connectedness, increase arts and cultural experiences, preserve heritage and foster diverse cultural sustainability within our shire.

The need to further nurture and develop arts and culture was highlighted by our community at the beginning of Council's term, which led to the creation of the Tourism, Arts and Culture Advisory Group and the development of an Arts and Culture Strategy.

Extensive consultation has taken place over a significant period of time both within our community and with the broader creative collectives to develop a strategy that is reflective of our current and future needs, that also addresses the desired Cultural, Social, Environmental, Economic and Governance outcomes.

Council encourages our community to take a look at the strategy and associated 12 month action plan and provide feedback to be considered in the final review of the strategy before it goes to Council for consideration.

Melbourne-based Dr Hernandez return to Ruffy for one night only playing an exciting mix of Boogaloo and Cumbian tunes. Over the last 75 years, Cumbia has grown to be one of the most widespread and unifying musical genres to emerge out of Latin America. The genre has its roots in Colombia and finds distinctive expressions across a range of countries.

'Boogalo' originated in New York City in the 1960s and is a fusion of rhythm and blues, soul, mambo, rumba and jazz, featuring lyrics in English and Spanish. Sally Ford's trademark soaring, bel canto vocal leads the five piece band which comprises Patrick Cronin on trumpet, flugelhorn and percussion, Michael Havir on keyboard, David Joseph on drums and Catherine McQuade on bass and vocals. Climate Conversations....

In response to last week's editorial I have received the following contributions to the climate conversation. Many thanks to John, Clare and Carole for their thoughtful points of view. Ed.

Hi Pauline,

You asked us to comment on climate change.

A general trend towards lower rainfall and warmer weather might actually benefit agriculture in our district where it is usually too cold and wet to grow many crops. Admittedly we have a problem with soil acidity and fertility generally, but this can be fixed, while a season's weather cannot.

Grazing is under increasing pressure from some environmentalists and this is a lot of what we do, particularly raising beef cattle. This is far from the traditional dairy farming of a century ago (when the Euroa Butter Factory paid a pound a pound for milk fat). Fine wool is also in resurgence a traditional product of the district and this is unlikely to suffer much from a warmer and drier climate, indeed stock losses from cold and wet weather may fall.

Above all we must do what good farmers always do, which is to think ahead and be prepared to change.


