HCCC News

Soil Carbon Project

The focus of this project is working with local farmers to develop best practice methodology using the latest research, tailored to local conditions and soil types, to increase the level of carbon in soil at the top soil and sub soil level.

HCCC has received a grant to conduct a pilot study into measuring and helping farmers to improve their soil carbon levels. It has been shown in previous work on farms that an increase in soil carbon can increase profitability on farms by up to \$200 per Ha per year.

The project team is now looking for EOI from 3 farmers to volunteer a paddock and some of their time to conduct this work.

Time is short & EOIs must be sent to Neil van Buuren by Friday 15 Feb

Methodology

Take soil sampling from 3 different farms / paddocks Conduct Workshops and field days on farms Advise farmers on change practises.

Outcomes and benefits

The primary long-term outcome is to help farmers increase the levels of soil carbon and improve farm productivity.

Increase the level of soil carbon to improve soil fertility and increase soil productivity

Increase pasture growth

Develop farming best practice guidelines that are specific to the catchment

Improve the productivity of cattle and sheep farmers in the region Help farmers develop resilience and adapt to a world that is warmer Make sure that the region's strong farming background continues and is sustainable in the future

The CFA unit will be housed on the Highlands-Caveat tanker and the Highlands Hall will be purchasing a unit in March which will be housed in the 'bus shelter' of the hall allowing it to be accessible to the whole community if ever needed.
