

Close to Home - Alice Pung

If you haven't read one of Alice Pung's previous books then you are in for a treat. Alice was born to Chinese Cambodian parents a month after they arrived in Australia as refugees fleeing the murderous Pol Pot regime. Her background therefore influences her

story writing but it also opens up a whole new world for thoughtful discovery. This latest offering "Close to Home – Selected Writings" is a skilfully edited book spanning a decade and a half of Alice's writing. It is lively, witty, thought-provoking, confronting and poignant. It is also a damn good read.

In this election year, this quote is timely advice. Politicians are already in election mode and the lines are firmly drawn, with very little attempt to seriously discuss issues or policy. It seems that fear has become the currency and winning the absolute aim. Honesty and morality have ceased to be relevant.

People seem to no longer trust politicians and when we reflect on the current situation it is easy to agree with this assumption. Yet do we not also 'get the politicians we deserve'. When I look at some of the people in our parliaments, I would be ashamed to have voted for them. I would have been ashamed to have voted for Donald Trump. He has few redeeming features, and that goes for some in our parliaments.

Who do we blame for the situation we are in, the politicians or we the voters? We can't exactly control what politicians say and do, but we can vote them in or out. A challenge to **think** for ourselves. It means being discerning in how we get our information, how we choose our media and being alert to the distortions of propaganda.

I am sure we will not agree on everything. We will have different priorities and different assessment of policies, but we can at least **think** and discuss in a mature manner. I only hope we all do that over the next few months. In the end, we have only ourselves to blame. **Think!**

The Importance of Paddock Trees

The importance of a single paddock tree is often underestimated. A paddock tree can reduce the evaporation of soil moisture and protects pastures: if you have a 20m tall tree in your paddock that tree can divert wind off the paddock for a distance up to 15 times the height of the tree. An individual paddock tree can also: create shade and shelter for stock during extreme heat, wind and cold and provide



homes and food for birds and insects that help pollinate and remove pests. Like to find out more? See calendar and attachment for further details.


