
Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

This week it's WINDOWS - courtesy of Environment Victoria's energy saving tips

Windows are one of the most vulnerable points in our homes for heat loss and gain. In fact, a wall with zero insulation is far better in terms of retaining heat/cool air than a window. That's why it's important we treat windows properly.

Hang makeshift, heavy curtains in front of your window, such as an old blanket

Heavy curtains can significantly reduce the heat the loss/gain of windows. Makeshift curtains from hanging a blanket over the window can make a difference.

Double glaze your windows for free using bubble wrap and water, or ClearFilm


Have you got spare bubble wrap lying around? Spray a small amount of water and stick the bubble side to the glass. It's the same outcome as double glazing at no cost! Alternatively, install a clear, plastic film, called Clear Film, which has the same effect as double glazing for about \$30.

With the library closed for the last 2 months and with restrictions still in place for gatherings the Tuesday Show for June is going on-line via ZOOM and their first speaker is **Prof. David Lindenmayer** a world renowned academic and scientist who is an expert in landscape ecology, conservation and biodiversity.

He will be presenting a session on forest ecology and management and protection.

Did you know?

As our power bills increase in size with monotonous regularity, there is a quiet power revolution happening in our country at present. There are over 100 micro-grid communities throughout Australia with 13 in the electorate of Indi alone, including Yackandandah (they hope to be totally renewable by 2022) and Euroa. Mooroopna has a solar farm with battery and Benalla has installed solar power in their kindergarten. The article below highlights the proposal for Yea introducing a Community Energy distribution scheme. Don't be put off by the Yea tag as it is possible that the scheme can incorporate the northern extremity of the Murrindindi Shire (Highlands, Caveat & Terip) too. If you are at all interested in connecting with the organisers of this project start with their FB page and stay tuned for further information.

2030 Yea Inc: Community Energy

2030 Yea Inc is now an incorporated association seeking grants and funding for renewable energy and energy efficiency projects in Yea. We want to work together with like-minded people/groups in Yea. Is this you?

Our goals

1. Ensure Yea has totally renewable energy sources by 2030

We will encourage the purchase of solar PV and bulk buy opportunities for buying heat pumps and other energy efficient devices. We will plan for a community-scale solar battery. The Australian Photovoltaic Institute shows incidence of solar in each postcode in Victoria. For 3717, (Flowerdale, Ghin Ghin, Glenburn, Homewood, Killingworth, Limestone, Murrindindi, Yea), 32.6 % of dwellings already have Solar PV installations. We are well on the way!

2. Build a Yea microgrid, a form of distributed energy (DER)

Microgrids are formed by sharing energy generated by solar panels between neighbours, even those without their own panels. Electricity use (solar system and battery), is monitored by a common microgrid operator: sending fast, accurate information to watch energy flow in real time. The microgrid operator shares (buys and sells) the available power between the consumers and only purchases from the grid when required.



3. Increase energy efficiency in Yea

This may involve retrofitting energy efficiency measures in older buildings (lights, insulation, gap stopping, new appliances), along with home energy assessments.

4. Community Engagement for energy efficiency in Yea

Visit 2030Yea FB site to see us at work. We will use short Vox Pop grabs with locals who have existing residential or commercial buildings with solar PV; provide Virtual Sustainability tours in local residential and commercial buildings, and tips on retrofitting for & by Yea locals. We also



want to work beside Yea community groups, including arts, sports & environment groups in community engagement about energy efficiency in Yea.

Will you join us in this new venture?

Tiger Snake - (Notechis Scutatus)

Tiger Snakes are named after their tiger like stripes. However, some Tiger Snakes do not have any stripes at all. Tiger Snakes are one of the most venomous snakes in the world. Their fangs are usually 3.5 – 5 mm in length. They can move through water with ease. When they feel threatened, they raise themselves off the ground and flatten their heads and neck, almost like a cobra.

Tiger Snakes are thick-bodied solid snakes; they are usually around 1 m long but may grow up to 1.5 m. Their head is slightly wider and distinct from their neck. Tiger Snakes main body colour ranges from grey-brown to black. However, their body colouration cannot be used as a sole method of identification, as there are many variations. Tiger Snakes are often marked by a series of dark brown and yellow-brown bands, but they may or may not be present. Their underbelly is generally lighter than the main body and un-banded.

A Tiger Snake's diet comprises of a wide range of food sources. They primarily eat frogs, but they also consume other reptiles, birds, small mammals and fish. Powerful chemicals in their venom help break down prey in their stomach. Warmth from the sun also aids in digestion of food.

Tiger Snakes can be found in a range of habitats. They are most often seen near creeks, rivers or swamps. Tiger Snakes are normally a ground-dwelling snake, but they have been recorded climbing small trees and shrubs. Tiger Snakes cannot maintain a constant body temperature without help from their environment. This means that they use the sun's warmth to raise their body temperature. Tiger Snakes are active during the day and also during the night in warmer weather. Tiger Snakes spend the cooler months sheltering in hollow logs, rodent burrows or other suitable sites.

Tiger Snake mating occurs throughout the summer and reaches a peak in late January and February. Females give birth to live young, usually to a litter of between 15-20 snakes, in late summer or early autumn. Tiger Snakes are around 10 cm long when born & female Tiger Snakes provide no maternal care to their young once they are born. In ideal conditions, females reproduce every second year.

Snakes are an important part of the ecosystem; they act as predators, reducing populations of overabundant pest species such as rats and mice. Snakes normally avoid people, but if they feel threatened, disturbed or surprised, they may attack. If provoked or cornered, Tiger Snakes may bite. All Tiger Snakes should be regarded as highly venomous and dangerous to humans.

Do not attempt to kill a snake; it is illegal and you are more likely to get hurt.




