
Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

We would like to thank all those who took the time to participate in our 2020 survey.


We now have a much greater understanding of who our members are, and what concerns them regarding the Landcare activity.

- 10. Protecting paddock trees and growing new ones








14% are holiday / weekend retreats


61% are willing to attend meeting

Making Cent\$ of Carbon & Emissions on Farms

As it cites in the introduction "Victorian farm businesses are getting on with the job of making more food and fibre, while dealing with changeable season & weather patterns. We also know that more attention is bring paid to the carbon and emissions performance of our agricultural industries and farms.... We know we must grow more food & fibre as the demand for food steadily increases. Farmers



are constantly looking for efficiencies to improve farm productivity and resilience while maintaining productivity."

FIRE SEASON PREPARATION

Council has simplified its burning-off laws to make it easier for residents to maintain their properties in preparation for the summer fire season.

Residents may now burn off at any time (excluding the Fire Danger Period) without requiring a permit, providing they meet the following conditions:

you must have adequate means available at all times to prevent the escape of fire and to extinguish the fire

the burn area must be cleared of flammable material for a minimum radius of 3 m

the fire must be extinguished if you are directed to do so by an authorised officer

you must ensure all ashes are spread and thoroughly extinguished at the completion of the burn

the smoke must not cause a nuisance

the burn pile must not include damp or green materials. The materials to be burned must be suitably dry (cured)

the fire must be adequately supervised, with an adult person present at all times

Additionally, if your land is less than one hectare, the burn pile must not exceed 1 m x 1 m.

If your land is more than one hectare:

the burn pile must be no more than 20 cubic meters

the fire must not be lit if wind speed exceeds 15 kph

the burn pile must not be located closer than 5 m to the property boundary or 5 m to any building

Any fire that does not meet these conditions will require a permit from Council. Please ensure you register all burns with the CFA by contacting 1800 668 511 before lighting your fire.

Sugar Glider – (Pretaurus Breviceps)

The Sugar Glider is found in northern and eastern Australia and in all states and territories. They live in forests and woodlands and have been known to survive in remnant vegetation.

The Sugar Glider is an arboreal mammal that is most active at night, sleeping by day in nests made of leaves found in tree hollows. Groups of up to 7 adults and their young may form a 'clan' and share a nest. Among their own clan they are playful and social, but they will defend their territory aggressively and noisily if threatened by other animals or approached by Sugar Gliders from a different clan. Dominant males mark other clan members and the territory around the nest with secretions from scent glands on their chest.

In flight the Sugar Glider uses its long bushy tail for stability and steering. It also has a membrane from its fifth finger to its ankle enabling it to glide up to 50 metres between trees. Nor a bad effort for a creature that it is only 16 – 21cm in body size ie: not counting the length of its tail.

The Sugar Glider commonly gives birth to twins which remain in their mother's pouch for just over 2 months. They then leave the nest to forage for food, usually with their mother. A Sugar Glider's diet consists of nectar, pollen, seeds, insects and sometimes even small birds and their eggs.

Sugar gliders can also enter a state called torpor, which enables them to slow their breathing and dramatically reduce physical activity for days or even weeks, dropping its body temperature and oxygen consumption and wrapping its body into a ball. This allows them to reduce energy needs and survive periods of food shortage.
