Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

What a pleasant change from a month ago with the cooler weather, low cloud and most welcome rain. It really doesn't seem like February at all.

However the month of February sees the annual Platypus and Rakali count happen around the countryside and the numbers logged give an idea of the health of the rivers and creeks where these delightful creatures inhabit.

Both need clean water, free from toxins and excessive nutrients, as well as banks that are not too steep, but soft enough to excavate a burrow in.

The amount of cover provided by vegetation along the banks, eucalypts and acacias in particular, along with shrubs and low-growing plants overhanging the water, also enhance a platypus/rakali's environment.

An ideal depth of 1-3 metres is preferred although 1-6 metres is fine and the bottom of the watercourse needs to be composed of relatively course inorganic materials such as gravel, pebbles and large rocks. This assists the platypus in its foraging for aquatic insects and other invertebrates.

These wonderful and unique creatures are a joy and we are very lucky that they inhabit waterways throughout the HCCC region. Maybe you've seen some nearby? Hope so.

Confronting Nonsense

I often find myself lost for words when someone makes a racist or sexist remark or espouses some dangerous opinion or conspiracy theory. When I get over the shock that a person could hold such views, I never seem to have the appropriate reply, until it is too late. Sometimes I have been confronting, but I tend to suspect I would just end up in a pointless argument.

While social media has some benefits, it does seem to facilitate the circulation of prejudice, ignorance and false information. With it, we seem to be losing the art of creative discussion. Can you really have a proper dialogue on Twitter? Hardly, it simply trivialises thinking.

Whether we are doing it on line or face to face how do we deal constructively with prejudice and 'bullsh*t' and still respect the other person? I believe we all have a responsibility to call out prejudice and ignorance, and feel disappointed with myself when I fail to do so. Consequently, I have been working on some strategies. It would be good to hear of other options.

For instance, when someone makes a prejudicial, sexist, or racist remark, we could simply ask, 'What were you thinking when you said that?' In this way, there is at least the possibility of some further discussion.

When someone makes comments that are clearly false and full of bias, one way of replying could be, 'How did you come to that position? Where did you get your information from?' I sometimes wish reporters would ask similar questions when interviewing politicians.

Facing up to the climate denier or sceptic, perhaps it is now time to ask them to give evidence for their opinion that there is no climate crisis. What do you think?

Fire awareness for all

Weekend project #3 - Enclose the sub-floor with a metal mesh. Flammable items are often stored underneath the house. If this area is not enclosed these items will catch, often due to ember attack, and pose a threat to every room in the house. The exposed underside of timber floors can be protected with a lightweight, non-combustible layer.
