The Corona Cup

The Wilderness V Richmond Union Over 60's

The Wilderness was confident of taking home the Corona Cup, mainly because all the Richmond players (average age 67) were in the high-risk category and would probably be in quarantine.

The Wilderness (average age about 50) boasting a team of 3 McAlpins, Marcus Hill and 2 McCooeys, quickly had Richmond effectively 3-55 after Cam Stewart Bowled Kevin Andersen (3), Marcus Hill got Terry Martin (8) and Andy Hansen retired hurt with a list of life-threatening injuries. However, some big hitting by Scott Longley (27no), Kim Bohem (32) and Shane Way (34no) saw Richmond to 130 at the end of their first innings

The Wilderness started strongly until Greg Pritchard's playboy lifestyle found him stumped for 7. Don Cook (14), Marcus Hill (32no again), Tom McCooey flying at 15 when he was caught one handed, going backwards, on the



boundary by that 60 year old Harry Sleigh and a superb captain's knock of 36 not out by Hamish McAlpin left them only 10 runs shy of Richmond at the Lunch break.

After an exceptionally healthy lunch provided by the Catering Corp underlings of Susie Sleigh and Melissa McDowell under the watchful eye of Helen Waterworth -the Tigers Tail wagged. Alan Jarrott chirped his way to 34, while the Late Harry Sleigh (25) (who played for Richmond because he was cut from the wilderness side due to late arrival-bad move in hindsight), new captain Scott McKay's quick fire 25 was completely eclipsed by the recently deposed captain Eane (Buffalo Bill) Witton 36 including 15 off his last over. The Richmond innings was rounded out by mid-season draft pick up Doug McLean with a face saving 2 before being caught superbly by Warwick Carter at Point.

The CFA officially declared an end to the fire danger period on **Monday 16 March.** From this time, residents in farming areas can burn off vegetation material without a permit. Residents in township zones and built up areas can burn-off vegetation material without a permit from **Monday 16 March 2020 to Monday 4 May 2020.**

Residents can also deposit green waste free of charge and all year round at any of Council's Resource Recovery Centres.



Lower than a Snake's armpit!

Riding for Disabled Seymour has been operating for 40 years but recently 9 children's helmets, some halters and lunging equipment stolen were from our shed in Kings Park. We cannot provide lessons without the special small sized helmets for our young participants. Volunteers have arrived to find the sheds and paddocks unlocked and left open. This has been reported to the police. The locks are in the process of being changed.

We are asking the Community to please let us know if they see any suspicious activity in our area behind the cutting yard, next to the dog walking park.

We need to raise funds to replace the stolen equipment, helmets which comply with the current Australian Safety Standards are approximately \$80-\$90 each. We welcome any donations from the community to help us pay for new helmets.

How can you help? Donations of \$90 will cover the cost of 1

child's helmet. Sponsor a rider, \$155 covers the cost of insurance, \$50 will cover the cost for a term of lessons (\$10 a lesson). Sponsor a horse for \$250 a year, we need to pay farrier costs, teeth and



vet bills. We cannot run our program without our special horses.
