* In order to alleviate the poor reception, particularly in the Kobyboyn valley and surrounding area, it is hoped that an extra Telstra tower will eventually be erected close to the Kobyboyn Exchange building. However this essential piece of infrastructure is dependent on Telstra receiving funding from the Federal Government for its erection. As a result it could take a couple of years to achieve this result!

They installed a lime trial comparing 2.5 tonne/Ha, seven tonne/Ha, and a control to increase soil pH and reduce

The Strathbogie SoilCare and Strathbogie Tableland

Landcare groups have been trailing ways to boost their

In their second trial, the group sowed nine acid-tolerant pasture species in the lime trial site.

A trial using Molybdenum (trace element in soils) and Gibberellic Acid (artificial hormone) has also been added.

Gecko CLaN Landcare Network installed a weather station and two moisture probes to 80cm at the trial site. Data collected includes rainfall, soil moisture and soil temperature.

The site has also had soil samples taken to 80cm to examine differences in soil structure down the profile.

Brad Costin, AgVic, and Damien Gerrans will discuss how to use the data to make on-farm decisions. We will assist land managers to log in and access the data monitoring site.

This project is supported by the Goulburn Broken CMA through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Program.

Soils and sequestering carbon

The potential of Australian soils to sequester carbon and offset emissions is a hot topic right now. But how do you go about building soil carbon? Dr Cassandra Schefe, a leading soil science researcher, presented the first Road to Net Zero webinar series - Understanding Soils. Dr Schefe took viewers back to basics, explaining the relationships between different soil characteristics and their contributions to a soil system. She then showed how farmers can use this knowledge to achieve an increase in carbon. This Webinar can be found on -

Cassandra also specialised in soil chemistry and soil-plant interactions, completing a PhD with Monash University on the interactions between carbon and fertilisers in improving nutrient availability in acid soils.
