
The silent auction of the old playground equipment saw 3 lots sold.

Background

The Strathbogie SoilCare and Strathbogie Tableland Landcare groups have been trailing ways to boost their pasture production since 2016.

They installed a lime trial comparing 2.5 tonne/Ha, seven tonne/Ha, and a control to increase soil pH and reduce aluminium.

In their second trial, the group sowed nine acid-tolerant pasture species in the lime trial site.

A trial using Molybdenum (trace element in soils) and Gibberellic Acid (artificial hormone) has also been added.

Gecko CLaN Landcare Network installed a weather station and two moisture probes to 80cm at the trial site. Data collected includes rainfall, soil moisture and soil temperature.

The site has also had soil samples taken to 80cm to examine differences in soil structure down the profile.

Brad Costin, AgVic, and Damien Gerrans will discuss how to use the data to make on-farm decisions. We will assist land managers to log in and access the data monitoring site.

Riparian Walk #3.6

After getting back into the swing of things in Upton Hill, we now find ourselves taking the final Riparian stroll for the year.

Continuing our exploration of the Seven Creeks we will be exploring the most upstream section to date. Starting on private property we will soon reach the Crown frontage. This runs all the way down to Gooram, which was the first ever riparian walk.

Expect a long walk (7.5kms / 4.5 hrs) of easy difficulty with blackberries and multiple creek crossings to contend with. Hiking experience isn't necessary but an average level of fitness and mobility will be required. The walk difficulty will increase if the weather is wet beforehand or hot on the day.

Walkers will meet on the side of the road where the Seven Creeks passes under Watkins Rd. From there walkers will enter private property before transitioning to the Seven Creeks Crown frontage. After crossing Ankers Rd and heading down to the Creek Junction Road there will be a short car shuffle back to the start.

HCCC is now looking for expressions of interest from all landowners to join in with the Landcare group in its annual helicopter spraying for Paterson's Curse.


The spraying will take place in May - June.


